CURRENT SITUATION:

Roads:

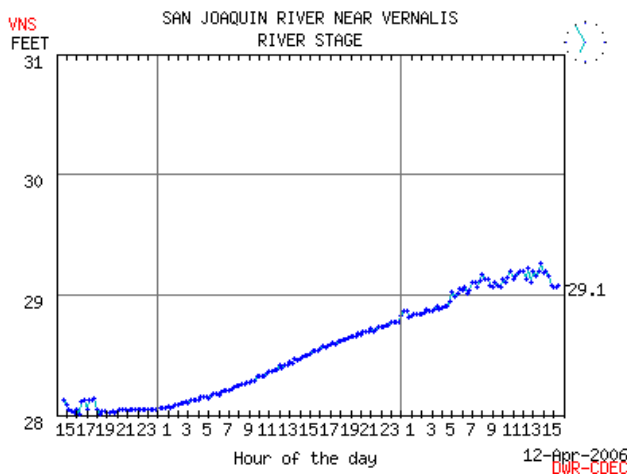
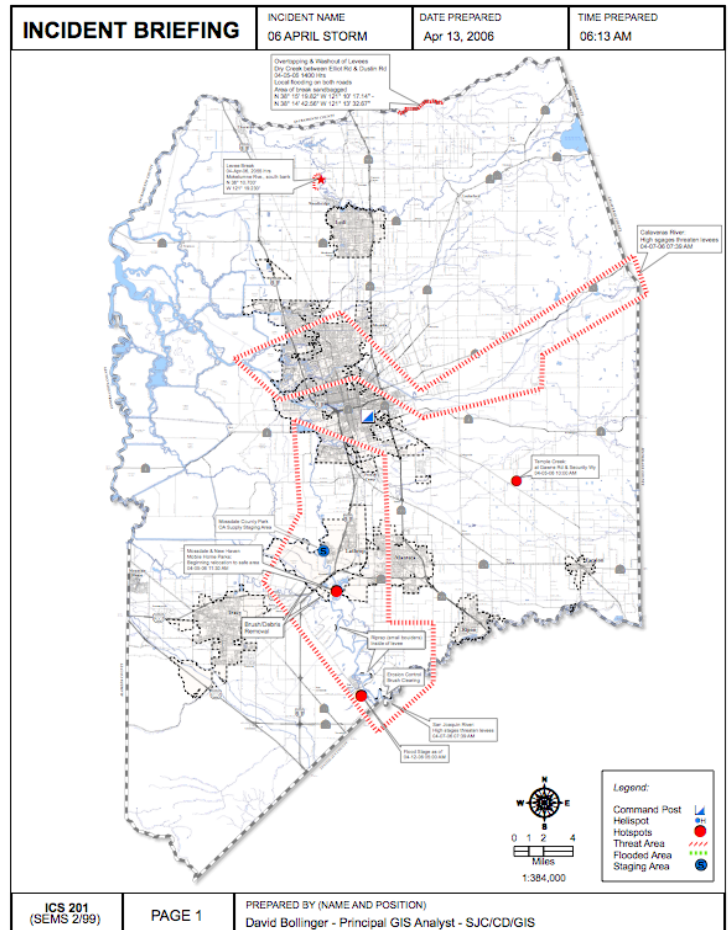
- Woodward Ave closed between McKinley and Airport Way as part of evacuation route.
- Perrin Road west of Airport Way, except local traffic.
- Hays Road open to local traffic only.
- South Airport Way closed between Airport Way North to McMullen Road
- HWY 99 Frontage road east and west sides of underpass at Mokelumne river
- Two Rivers road closed at Two Rivers RV park entrance.

Relocations:

- Residents at Mossdale Trailer Park and Two Rivers RV Park have relocated RVs from low-lying areas. Some residents from other RV parks have also relocated.
- No relocations have been reported from other locations of the county.

River Status:

- San Joaquin River water levels continue to be monitored at Vernalis Station. As of 07:00 a.m., Thursday morning, water level was at 29.21 feet (see graph). Flood stage is 29 feet. Danger level is 29.5.



Flooding (Residential):

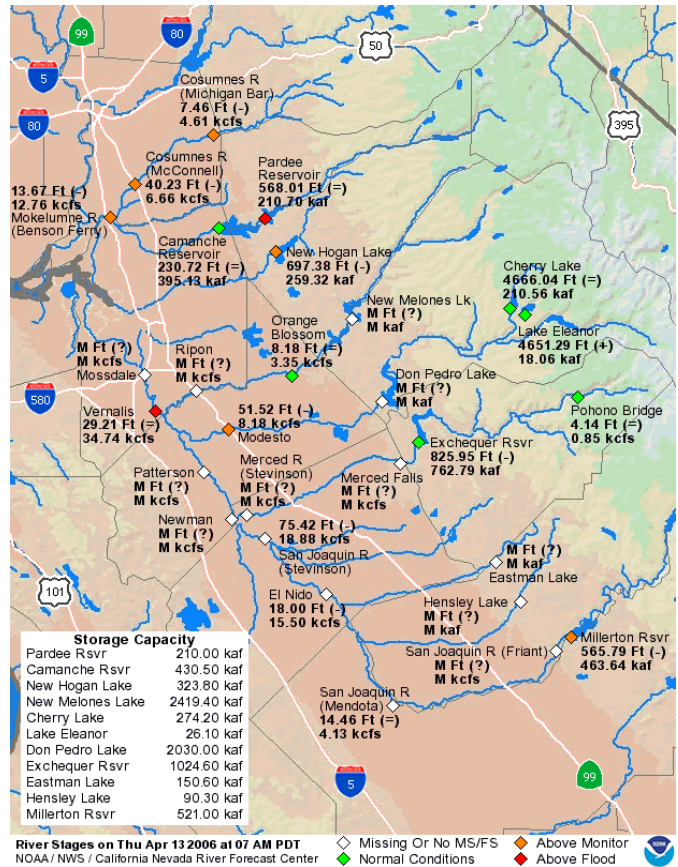
- None reported at this time, beyond localized pools in low-lying areas adjacent to levees. People living near San Joaquin river system levees are encouraged to pay attention to NOAA weather radio or your local media for the latest updates on this situation. Be prepared to take action if an evacuation is ordered in your area.
- County Public Works continues to engage in pumping storm water runoff from low-lying areas of Boggs Tract as required.

Flooding (Rivers):

All major rivers in San Joaquin County are being monitored. Only the San Joaquin River at Vernalis continues to be at flood stage as of 08:00 a.m. this morning. The San Joaquin river and its tributaries will remain at elevated water levels for an extended period. Flood warnings from the National Weather Service have been issued for Vernalis. An additional concern is that warming temperatures will cause increased water runoff, potentially impacting the already high water levels in San Joaquin County reservoirs, rivers and streams.

CONSEQUENCES:

- 1. Relocations** – Mossdale Trailer Park; Two Rivers RV Park. None due to Mokelumne River levee break.
- 2. Sheltering** – American Red Cross is planning shelter areas in the county.
- 3. School Closings** – None at this time
- 4. Power Outages and Utilities** – No reports.
- 5. Government Closings** - None at this time.
- 6. Fatalities and Injuries** – No reports
- 7. Boil Water Notices** – No reports



WEATHER:

- **Thursday:** Improved conditions with partly cloudy skies and a 20 percent chance of rain showers. Highs will range between 65 to 75 degrees with southeast winds up to 10 mph. Thursday night will be mostly cloudy with a 40 percent chance of rain. Overnight lows will range between 49 to 55 degrees with southeast winds around 10 mph.
- **Friday:** rain is likely in the morning, tapering off to rain showers in the afternoon. Afternoon temperatures will range from 63 to 70. Light west winds predicted between 10 to 15 mph with higher gusts in the late afternoon.
- **Weekend:** Weather conditions for the weekend and into Monday will similar to Friday's conditions with intermittent showers and a possibility of rain. Winds will remain westerly up to 10 mph.
- A break in the weather pattern is predicted for Tuesday.

- **Road Closure –**
 - Woodward Ave. between McKinley and Airport Way via Manteca. This is part of evacuation route from Wetherbee Lake.
 - Perrin Rd closed between Airport Way north to McMullen Rd. closed 4/9/06 @ 14:30 for emergency levee shore up operations.
- **OES – Staffing has been adjusted below Level I to meet operational needs and staffing capabilities for a duration longer than originally planned.**
- **San Joaquin County Sheriff's Office continues to monitor the Mokelumne River for any river breaches when required**
- **Boils and other signs of fatigue are showing on the levee systems, especially in the southern San Joaquin River area. DWR in conjunction with USACE and local Reclamation Districts are identifying, assessing and repairing as needed.**
