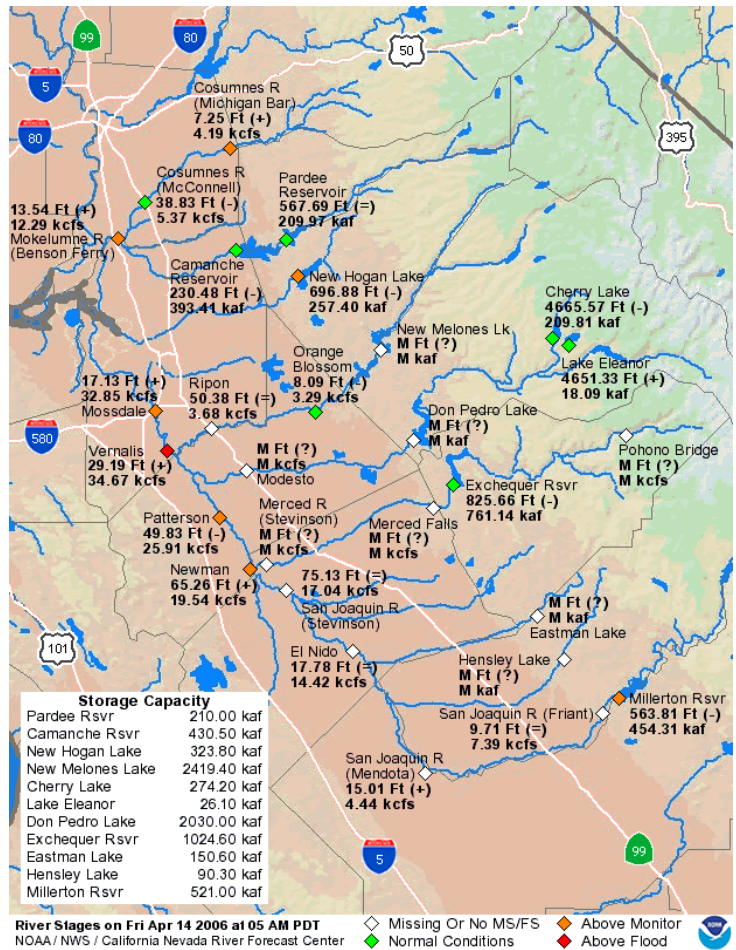


Flooding (Residential):

- None reported at this time, beyond localized pools in low-lying areas adjacent to levees. People living near San Joaquin river system levees are encouraged to pay attention to NOAA weather radio or your local media for the latest updates on this situation. Be prepared to take action if an evacuation is ordered in your area.

Flooding (Rivers):

All major rivers in San Joaquin County are being monitored. A restriction on Recreational Vessel traffic remains in place for the San Joaquin River system south of the Stockton Main Ship Channel. The San Joaquin river and its tributaries will remain at elevated water levels for an extended period. Flood warnings from the National Weather Service have been issued for San Joaquin County. State Flood Operations Center estimates the San Joaquin River level will drop to 28’ by late Friday or Saturday. The present trend shows this occurring.



CONSEQUENCES:

- 1. Relocations** – Mossdale Trailer Park; Two Rivers RV Park.
- 2. Sheltering** – American Red Cross has planned shelter areas in the county.
- 3. School Closings** – None at this time.
- 4. Power Outages and Utilities** – No reports.
- 5. Government Closings** - None at this time.
- 6. Fatalities and Injuries** – No reports
- 7. Boil Water Notices** – No reports

WEATHER:

- **Saturday:** Overcast in the morning changing to shower and rain in the evening. Southeast winds to 10 mph.
- **Sunday:** Rain showers throughout the day. Should not see same intensity as previous activity. South winds to 10 mph.

SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY ACTIONS:

- **The County has issued an emergency order to grant access to all private and, or public levees or property on, near or adjacent to the San Joaquin River and the Stanislaus River. See the SJC OES website for more details.**
- **OES – Staffing has been adjusted below Level I to meet operational needs and staffing capabilities for a time-frame longer than originally planned. The EOC will remain staffed at Level I (modified) throughout the weekend until Monday morning.**
- **Boils and other signs of fatigue are showing on the levee systems, especially in the southern San Joaquin River area. DWR in conjunction with USACE and local Reclamation Districts are identifying, assessing and repairing as needed.**

OPERATIONAL AREA CITIES:

- **CITY OF STOCKTON**
 - **No problems reported at this time. City of Stockton has assisted with OES staffing. Holt Caterpillar on HWY 4 engaged in relocating inventory throughout County. Rumors begun over possible “evacuation” due to movement of equipment. No evacuation orders have been issued by City of Stockton.**
- **CITY OF LODI**
 - **No problems reported at this time. City of Lodi has assisted with OES staffing.**
- **CITY OF LATHROP**
 - **No problems reported at this time. Public Works addressing issue of street flooding in Lathrop due to inoperation of an agricultural system pump. Local flooding not associated with a levee or levee integrity.**
- **CITY OF MANTECA**
 - **No problems reported at this time. City of Manteca has assisted with OES staffing.**
- **CITY OF RIPON**
 - **No problems reported at this time. City of Ripon has assisted with OES staffing.**
- **CITY OF ESCALON**
 - **No problems reported at this time.**
- **CITY OF TRACY**
 - **No problems reported at this time. City of Tracy has assisted with OES staffing.**
