COMMITTEE FACT SHEET

NAME: **AGRICULTURAL TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

COMPENSATION: None.

LEGAL AUTHORITY: Ordinance Code of San Joaquin County, Section 9-1080.8; San Joaquin County Agriculture Mitigation Ordinance #4308 Adopted November 21, 2006.

MEMBERSHIP, QUALIFICATIONS, & RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS: The Commission shall consist of:
3 representatives appointed by the San Joaquin Farm Bureau Federation;
3 representatives appointed by the Building Industry Association;
3 representatives appointed by the Board of Supervisors, in which the appointees from the SJ Farm Bureau Federation and the BIA are ratified by the Board of Supervisors and in which a supermajority vote (i.e., a 2/3 vote of its members) is a requirement for, and a decision by, the Agricultural Technical Advisory Committee.

TERM: 5 members shall be initially appointed for 2 year terms which shall be applicable to 2 of the appointees of the Building Industry Association, 2 of the appointees of the SJ Farm Bureau Federation, and 1 of the appointees of the Board of Supervisors.
4 members shall be appointed for 4 year terms which shall be applicable to 1 of the appointees of the Building Industry Association, 1 of the appointees of the SJ Farm Bureau Federation, and 2 of the appointees of the Board of Supervisors.

DUTIES:

1. Adopt rules of procedure and bylaws governing the operation of the advisory committee and the conduct of its meetings;
2. Develop and recommend a Mitigation Strategy with approval by the Board of Supervisors occurring one year after adoption of this Chapter (Ordinance #4308, dated November 21, 2006), which includes a report recommending the conditions under which land with overlapping encumbrances could be considered as Agricultural Mitigation Land;
3. Develop a report for consideration by the Board of Supervisors within one year from the effective date of this Chapter concerning different agricultural mitigation ratios and definitions for the Delta and for Prime Agricultural land;
4. Consider and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors regarding future consideration of the inclusion of land outside the County as allowable Agricultural Mitigation Land, and regarding agricultural mitigation strategies other than the hybrid in-lieu fee/in-kind land approach set forth in this Chapter; and
5. Explore the concept of establishing a Mitigation Bank.
