Part 2: DEFINITIONS

Section 100: DELINQUENCY DATE shall mean, in the case of a newly established business or activity at any location, any day or date during which an operation has commenced or begun without first having obtained an Environmental Health Permit; and, in the case of a business or activity at any location pursuant to regulations hereinafter resolved, which qualifies for a renewal of an Environmental Health Permit, the day following the PERIOD OF PERMIT VALIDITY specified on the Environmental Health Permit.

Section 101: HEALTH OFFICER shall mean the Health Officer of the County of San Joaquin, or designee.

Section 102: DIRECTOR OF ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH shall mean the Director of the Environmental Health Department of the County of San Joaquin, or designee.

Section 103: PERSON(S) shall mean any individual, partnership, firm, corporation, business, activity or combination thereof.

Section 104: ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH PERMIT, hereinafter termed "Permit," shall mean an official recognition of each operation of a Person who may conduct any business, occupation, or other activity hereinafter regulated; the form of which is to be established by the Director of Environmental Health and uniformly applied to all Persons; no Person shall operate without a valid or conditional Permit and such Permit shall be subject to the regulations hereinafter set forth; and such Permit may be suspended or revoked in accordance with Section 307 of these regulations. Such Permit shall remain the expressed property of San Joaquin County and shall be prominently displayed in public view during all hours of any business, occupation or activity of any Person, at the place of such business, occupation or activity of such Person, in accordance with the direction of the Director of Environmental Health.

Section 105: PERIOD OF PERMIT VALIDITY: A Permit, when issued, shall be valid, unless otherwise suspended or revoked, as categorically listed hereinafter, for the period specified on the Permit and in accordance with the established fee schedule.

- Section 106:** FOOD: As defined in the *California Health and Safety Code (HSC)*.
- Section 107:** FOOD SAFETY TRAINING FOR NEW FACILITY OPERATOR OR PERMITTEE: Locally required food safety training has been preempted by Section 113716 of the *California Health and Safety Code (HSC)*, which establishes “Minimum Standards of Knowledge in Food Safety.” However, at the discretion of the Hearing Officer, completion of additional food safety training, conducted by the Environmental Health Department or other certified food safety training provider, may be required.
- Section 108:** FAILURE TO COMPLETE FOOD SAFETY TRAINING: The fee for Environmental Health Department provided food safety training, which has been ordered by the Hearing Officer during a suspension/revocation hearing, shall be due and payable at the time of the hearing. Failure to attend the mandatory training within a six (6) month period will result in the suspension of the Environmental Health Permit.
- Section 109:** ADDITIONAL ROUTINE INSPECTION: Facilities which are found to be in substantial noncompliance at the time of a routine inspection and which require a reinspection or other enforcement action shall be subject to an additional routine inspection to verify continued compliance. This additional inspection may be scheduled after the facility has been brought into compliance and before the next routine inspection. An inspection fee shall be charged at the time of the additional routine inspection.
- Section 110:** SWAP MEET/FLEA MARKET/OPEN AIR MARKET SITE OPERATOR FOOD FACILITY PERMIT: The operator of a swap meet, flea market or open air market site shall maintain adequate restroom facilities, solid waste storage and disposal, liquid waste disposal facilities and vector control. The site operator shall require any vendor selling food at the site to possess a valid Environmental Health Permit.
- Section 119:** ICE PLANT: As defined in the *California HSC*.
- Section 126:** HOTEL/MOTEL: As defined in the *Uniform Building Code*.
- Section 127:** POULTRY FARM: Any facility in which the primary purpose is the keeping of poultry for egg production. Poultry farm does not include litter operations for the raising of chickens for food.
- Section 128:** KENNELS: The keeping of more than three dogs over four months of age as a business or in any one family unit, as defined in the *Ordinance Code* of San Joaquin County. Kennel does not include animal hospitals operated by a licensed veterinarian for the treatment and cure of sick or injured dogs or animals.
- Section 129:** EMPLOYEE (FARM WORKER) HOUSING: As defined in the *California HSC* and in *Title 25* of the *California Code of Regulations (CCR)*.
- Section 134:** SMALL PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM: As defined in the *California HSC*¹, *Title 17* and *Title 22* of the *California CCR*, and the *California Water Code*.
- Section 136:** PUBLIC SWIMMING POOL: As defined in the *California HSC* and *Title 22* and *Title 24* of the *California CCR*.
- Section 137:** RESORT (NATURAL BATHING SITE): A resort, bathhouse, or other public bathing or swimming place for the purpose of accommodating bathers, bordering upon or adjoining a seacoast, lake, river or stream, as defined in the *California HSC*.
- Section 138:** SEPTIC TANK PUMPER VEHICLE: Any vehicle used for the pumping and cleaning of septic tanks or chemical toilets, as specified in the *California HSC*¹.
- Section 140:** WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT: As described in the *Ordinance Code* of San Joaquin County and the Rules and Regulations (Standards) concerning individual sewage disposal systems.
- Section 141:** HAZARDOUS WASTE GENERATOR: As defined in the *California HSC*, *Chapter 6.5* and *Title 22* and *27* of the *California CCR*².

Section 142: HAZARDOUS WASTE TIERED PERMITTING ACTIVITIES: Onsite Hazardous Waste treatment and/or storage activities as defined in the *California HSC, Chapter 6.5 and Titles 22 and 27 of the California CCR*.

Section 143: SOLID WASTE FACILITIES/VEHICLES: As defined in *Title 14 of the California CCR*, and the *Ordinance Code* of San Joaquin County.

Section 145: UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK As defined in the *California HSC, Chapter 6.7 and Title 23 of the California CCR*.

Section 148: MEDICAL WASTE GENERATOR: As defined in the *California HSC and Title 22 of the California CCR*.

Section 155: AGRICULTURAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITY: As defined in *Title 14 of the California CCR*, and the *Ordinance Code* of San Joaquin County.

Section 157: MILK DISPENSING UNITS: As defined in the *California Food and Agricultural Code* and shall be assessed on a flat fee basis.

Section 158: CORRECTIVE ACTION: Investigation and/or remediation activities at underground storage tank sites, as defined in *California HSC, Division 20*, and other specific contaminated sites.

Section 159: OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCY LEAD SITE: A site at which contamination investigation, remediation and/or monitoring activities are undertaken at the direction and/or with oversight by the Central Valley Regional Water Control Board, Department of Health Services, Department of Toxic Substances Control, United States Environmental Protection Agency or other regulatory agency.

Section 160: ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT: Environmental quality assessment at a site to determine the presence of contamination.

Part 3: PERMIT APPLICATION / ISSUANCE / CONDITIONS

Section 200: FILING OF APPLICATION FOR ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH PERMIT: Every person, firm, partnership or corporation within the boundaries of San Joaquin County and specifically regulated thereby, shall apply for a Permit, and/or renewal of a Permit when one has been previously revoked or suspended, or for renewal of an expired Permit and shall, at the time of making application on forms provided by the San Joaquin County Environmental Health Department, remit the appropriate fee in accordance with the fee schedule contained herein. All prior unpaid charges associated with the facility owner of record or applicant shall be paid before a Permit to operate is issued. No fee received by the San Joaquin County Environmental Health Department shall be refundable unless approved by the Director of Environmental Health or his/her designee.

Section 202: TRANSFER OF HEALTH PERMIT: For Permit categories listed under Section 105 (A), any Permit required by these Regulations shall not be transferred by the holder from one site to another, or from one vehicle to another, but may be transferred from one person or operation to another at the same site by the payment of a transfer fee unless the Permit category is subject to an Anniversary Date Permit or otherwise regulated by the *California HSC1*. Eligible Permits shall be transferred within thirty (30) days from the date of the recorded change of ownership. Permits not transferred within this time period are subject to a Reinstatement Fee. Any other Permit required by these Regulations shall not be transferred by the holder from one site to another unless approved in writing by the Director of Environmental Health or his/her designee, and after payment of a transfer fee.

Section 203: ANNIVERSARY DATE HEALTH PERMIT: The Director of Environmental Health may designate certain Permit categories listed under Section 105 (A), as subject to an Anniversary Date Health Permit. For these Permit categories, the period of permit validity shall be for one year from the date of Permit issuance and subject to annual renewal thereafter. Upon a change of business ownership, the Permit shall expire within thirty (30) days of the date of ownership change. Subsequent operations or activities conducted without a valid Permit shall be subject to a fee for operating without a Permit.

Section 301: PRORATION OF FEES: Every PERSON or other subject entity who becomes subject to this regulation shall apply for a Permit and shall pay a fee in accordance with those set by this or subsequently adopted regulation. For the purpose of pro-ration of fees for entities subject to an annual fee, except as described in Section 203, but whose operation commences and continues to operate during a period less than twelve (12) months, such entities shall pay a prorated annual fee, except for temporary food establishments, vending machines and vehicles. Permit fees may be prorated at the time the Permit is issued for one (1), two (2) or three (3) quarters of a year if the applicant demonstrates the activity is to be carried on for a limited period of time.

Section 302: PENALTY: All fees shall be due and payable on the first business day of the month indicated in the foregoing Period of Health Permit Validity, and such fees are receivable for a thirty (30) day calendar period following the due and payable date. Fees charged in this regulation, which are not received or post marked within the thirty (30) day calendar period following the due and payable date, shall be increased by 100% for the following thirty (30) day period, and shall be received by the Director of Environmental Health prior to issuance of any Permit and/or authorization to operate. Operation without a Permit constitutes a separate violation of locally applicable State law. All other fees that are unpaid after thirty (30) days of billing shall be subject to a 10% penalty per month.

Section 303: ACTION UPON RECEIPT OF APPLICATION ISSUANCE OF PERMIT: Upon receipt of the application and fee, the Director of Environmental Health or his/her authorized agent shall issue the Health Permit in accordance with State law, and/or locally more restrictive Ordinance Code or Regulations (Standards). Any inspection services billing that remains unpaid more than thirty (30) days beyond the billing due date shall be subject to 10% penalty per month on the unpaid balance and revocation of non-cash payment privileges, and/or issuance of additional Permits.

Section 304: SEPARATE ACTIVITIES: If a Person engages in, conducts, manages, or carries on at the same time more than one of the activities for which a Permit is required by State Law, Local Ordinance Code or Regulation, such person shall be deemed to be engaged in conducting, managing, or carrying on each such activity separately and apart from the other such activity and a separate Permit shall be procured for each activity, whether located on the same premises or not.

Section 305: EXHIBITION OF PERMIT: Every Person having a Permit issued under provision of these Regulations shall exhibit the same in prominent public view at all times of operation, and shall produce the same whenever requested to do so by an officer authorized to issue, inspect or collect such Permits. For any fixed equipment, mobile, itinerant or moveable activity for which a Permit is required, a Permit shall be available in a location prescribed by the Director of Environmental Health.

Section 306: DAMAGED, DESTROYED OR LOST PERMIT: In the event a Permit is lost, damaged or destroyed, the Director of Environmental Health may issue a duplicate Permit to the owner thereof who shall remit the duplicate Permit fee prescribed in this regulation.

Section 307: REVOCAION OR SUSPENSION OF PERMIT: The Director of Environmental Health shall give opportunity for an administrative hearing to be held by the Director of Environmental Health or a person appointed by the Director as Hearing Officer, to determine whether or not the Permit of an establishment should be suspended, modified or revoked, whenever it appears, by reason of an Environmental Health investigation, that the holder of such Permit or his employee, servant or agent, or any person acting with his/her consent or under his/her authority, has, or may have, violated any provision of Federal, State or Local Law, Codes or Regulations, or any relevant agreement or requirement established or provided by same.

Section 308: APPEALS TO BOARD OF SUPERVISORS: Any Person whose application for a Permit or for approval of a proposed action under these regulations, as defined by the Director of Environmental Health, is denied, may within ten (10) calendar days after the date of such denial, appeal therefrom in writing to the Board of Supervisors on forms provided by the Director of Environmental Health. Such appeal shall be heard by the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors shall uphold or reverse the denial as may be necessary to protect and preserve the public health in accordance with applicable Laws, Codes, Ordinances and Regulations (Standards) but in no event may have the power to countermand Federal, State or Local Law, Codes or Ordinances; the appeal of which will not be heard.

Section 309: ENFORCEMENT OF DIRECTOR OF ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH: The Director of Environmental Health shall enforce all Orders, Rules and Regulations (Standards) necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of these Regulations (Standards), and may perform all other acts necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of this Division. No portion of these Regulations (Standards) shall be interpreted to exempt any Person from action initiated by the San Joaquin County Environmental Health Department as may be required in the enforcement of Federal and State Laws, Regulations (Standards) or Local Ordinances.

If any provision of these Rules and Regulations (Standards) or the application thereof to any Person or circumstances, is held invalid, the remainder thereof and the application of such provisions to other Persons or circumstances, shall not be affected thereby.

That the following San Joaquin County Environmental Health Permit Fees and Service Charges be and are hereby adjusted, effective August 1, 2010.
