SUBJ.: 2009 Policy Updates

The following is summary of Policies that are new, revised or have been deleted. These changes will be effective January 1, 2010.

New Policies:

2541 – Paramedic Infrequently Used Skills: Requires ALS providers to require paramedic to demonstrate competency for infrequently used skills, (i.e., adult and pediatric oral intubation).

2551 – 12 Lead EKG Performance Criteria

2522 – King Airway Performance Criteria

2553 – Endotracheal Intubation – Pediatric Performance Criteria

2554 - Continuous Positive Airway Pressure (CPAP) Performance Criteria

4441 – EMS Aircraft Classification and Authorization: States the requirements and procedures for classifying EMS aircraft and authorizing EMS aircraft providers to operate in San Joaquin County.

4442 – EMS Aircraft Medical Control: States the procedures for on-line medical control from the time the EMS aircraft arrives on scene until the patient has arrived at an acute care facility.

5102 – Patient Privacy: Provides guidance for maintaining privacy and confidentiality of protected health information.

Revised Policies:

2101 EMS Dispatcher: Continuing Education requirements has been removed, but dispatchers must submit a copy of their renewed NAEMD Certification.

2210 – Emergency Medical Responder (formerly First responder): Certification name changed to be inline with national standards. DOJ background check is now required for all new and one time for all currently certified EMR's.

2310 – EMT Certification: Language was added that only requires the EMS Agency to maintain DOJ results for 90 for those that are not already on file.

2540 Paramedic Accreditation: Requires new paramedics to the County to attend and orientation at the EMS Agency and complete the accreditation process prior to being issued

an accreditation card. Paramedics applying for continuous accreditation must attend a Policy Skills Review within 6 months of expiration.

2545 – Endotracheal Intubation – Adult Performance Criteria: The Policy had several significant changes, they are; 1) requires that paramedics utilize a team approach when performing intubation, 2) that the endotracheal tube inducer be utilized on the first attempt, 3) that for external laryngeal manipulation only bimanual laryngoscopy be utilized, and 4) patients will be placed in the ear to sternal notch position for intubation versus the sniffing position.

2610 – MICN Authorization: A requirement was added that MICN's have to submit a copy of their CPR card for both initial and reauthorization.

4102 – ALS Standard Medication and Equipment Inventory: There were numerous changes to required drug quantities and the deletion of the 50cc and 250cc NASL bags. The King Airway was added and has to be carried by all ALS providers by 12/31/2010 at the same time the Combi-Tube has to be removed by that date. The other significant changes requires providers to develop a daily checkout sheet which lists all required items in this Policy and that the attending paramedic on each unit is responsible to ensure that all drugs and equipment are present at the beginning of each shift, all equipment is functioning properly, and that all battery-powered devices are charged.

4980 – Receiving Hospital Diversion: The Policy was reformatted into three sections Diversion Avoidance, Hospital Initiated Diversion, and EMS Agency Duty Officer Initiated Diversion. The Policy also outlines at what points a hospital or the EMS Duty officer shall place a hospital on diversion for delaying the transfer of ambulance patients.

5103 – Determination of Death: A new section was in regards to Indications for Rapid Transport and Resuscitation, the special considerations section was reworded, and the time requirement for working a code on scene was reduced from 20 to 15 minutes.

5700 – ALS Introduction: A paragraph was added that states the Base Hospital Physicians may order any medication or procedure within the paramedic scope of practice for any patient condition regardless of the treatment protocols and what documentation is required by the paramedic for these orders.

5702 – ALS Advanced Airway Management: The requirement that the endotracheal tube inducer (ETTI) be utilized on all intubation attempts. The King Airway was added as a rescue airway and the Cormack-Lehane grading scale was incorporated.

5715 – ALS Asystole: The time listed in Line I was changed from 20 minutes to 15 minutes.

5753 – ALS Seizures: In line D, the following language was added to clarify the Policy "treat as indicated for seizures per this policy".

5763 – ALS Severe PreEclampsia/Eclampsia: Magnesium Sulfate administration was changed from IV piggyback to IV push. The new language states "Magnesium Sulfate 2Gms slow IVP over 3 – 5 minutes".

5764 – ALS Imminent Delivery: BLS Policy numbers and names corrected to match the BLS Policy.

5906 – Continuous Positive Airway Pressure (CPAP): Reporting requirements were deleted from the Policy.
