#### For Friday, April 21, 2006

Mostly cloudy with a chance of light rain showers. A slight chance of thunderstorms in the afternoon with highs around 69. Northwest winds up to 10 mph.

#### For Friday, April 22, 2006

Mostly cloudy with a chance of light rain showers. Highs around 67 with light winds. For Saturday evening the forecast is for mostly cloudy with a slight chance of light rain Showers. Lows around 46 with northwest winds to around 10 mph.

#### Long term:

Weather pattern should continue through Sunday with a chance of thundershowers and showers developing during the late afternoon and into the weekend. T-storm activity will be more prevalent along the Sierra Nevada foothills. Projections do not show this storm activity to be as severe as seen in the last several days. Normal temperatures should return by Monday, however, another weak system will be moving in on Tuesday and Wednesday of next week.
