Exhibit G2C Grower Located Inside the Core Area of the Quarantine

PROVISIONS FOR THE INTRASTATE MOVEMENT OF ALL EXOTIC FRUIT FLY HOST MATERIAL (FFHM) ORIGINATING FROM AREAS QUARANTINED FOR AN EXOTIC FRUIT FLY

1. All exotic Fruit Fly Host Material (FFHM) (see host list) from a growing site, located inside the core area of the quarantine, will be placed on hold by the Project.
2. All FFHM grown within the core area of the quarantine is **not** eligible for pre-harvest bait treatment.
3. All FFHM from a growing site, located inside the core area of the quarantine, **may only move from the growing site with prior approval of the Project.**
4. FFHM grown inside the core area of the quarantine may be handled in one of the following ways without the need for Project approval:
 - a) Stored and consumed on the growing site, **or,**
 - b) Processed onsite in a manner approved by the Project (cooking, drying, freezing, juicing, canning, pureeing, grinding, etc.)
5. FFHM grown inside the core area of the quarantine may be eligible for post-harvest treatment. Treatment certification must be obtained from the Project. Not every commodity is eligible for post-harvest treatment.
6. All treatments of FFHM must:
 - a) be at the request of the grower
 - b) be witnessed by the Project
 - c) be conducted under the direction of the Project
 - d) occur at an approved facility operating under compliance with the Project
7. FFHM must be transported by a Hauler under Compliance with the Project to a Project approved treatment facility.
8. All *treated* FFHM shall be safeguarded until it leaves the Quarantine Area, in a Project approved manner.
9. Periodic inspections will be conducted by the Project in order to verify compliance with these stipulations.
10. Failure to comply with all stipulations of this exhibit may result in fruit seizure, violations being issued to you, and/or revocation of this agreement.

Special Instructions:

- The Project does not assume responsibility or liability of commodity damage as a result of treatment.
- Please consult with the Project to determine:
 - possible and authorized treatment for the commodity
 - location of Project approved treatment facilities proximal to the growing site
 - safeguarding methods to be used during transport to/from commodity treatment facility
