LEGAL AUTHORITY:	Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5604 (Amended November 1992); Board Order B-93-422 dated March 23, 1993; Board Order B-01-615 dated May 8, 2001; and Board Order B-08-85 dated January 22, 2008.
MEMBERSHIP, QUALIFICATIONS, & RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS:	Must be a resident of San Joaquin County. 15 Members - 1 Person must be a representative of the Board of Supervisors; 50% of the Membership must be consumers or parents, spouse, sibling or adult children of consumers of services, who are receiving or have received mental health services; at least 20% of the members shall be consumers, and at least 20% shall be families of consumers. The 15 members shall represent the demographics of the County as a whole.
TERM:	3 Year Terms with the requirement that terms shall be equitably staggered so that approximately 1/3 of the appointments shall expire annually.
