- LEGAL AUTHORITY:** Board Order B-91-1071 dated July 9, 1991 in accordance with State Law established by AB 2141, Chapter 1187 and AB 1542, Chapter 270 dated August 1997; Board Order B-01-1135 dated August 21, 2001; and Board Order B-03-296 dated March 4, 2003.
- MEMBERSHIP, QUALIFICATIONS, & RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS:** 30 Members jointly appointed by the County Board of Supervisors (15) and County Superintendent of Schools (15) from each of the five categories. Membership follows the guidelines of AB 1542. Members are appointed from the following five categories:
- a) 20% consumers (defined as parent or person who receives or who has received within the past 36 months, child care services).
 - b) 20% child care providers (defined as a person who provides child care services or represents persons who provide child care services).
 - c) 20% public agency representatives (defined as person(s) who represents a city, county, city and county or local education agency).
 - d) 20% community representatives (defined as a person who represents an agency or business that provides private funding for child care services, or who advocates for child care services through participation in civic or community-based organizations but is not a child care provider and does not represent an agency that contracts with the California Department of Education (CDE) to provide child care and development services).
 - e) 20% are discretionary appointees (appointed from any of the above categories or outside of these categories at the discretion of the appointing agencies).
- TERM:** 2 Year Terms.
- DUTIES:**
1. Establish and periodically update local priorities for maintenance, expansion, and improvement of child care services.
 2. Establish priorities for the distribution of federal, state, and local child development programs.
 3. Advise County Board of Supervisors, county Superintendent of Schools, and other local, state and federal policymakers about child care issues.
 4. Provide links between government and community to work to maximize the amount of impact of local, state, federal, and private resources and funding for child care in San Joaquin County.

NAME: **SAN JOAQUIN VALLEY UNIFIED AIR POLLUTION CONTROL DISTRICT CITIZEN'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

COMPENSATION: None.

LEGAL AUTHORITY: Resolution No. 08-12-09 Adopted by the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District Governing Board December 18, 2008.

MEMBERSHIP, QUALIFICATIONS, & RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS: Each Board of Supervisors of the eight (8) member counties shall appoint two (2) members to the CAC. One (1) member shall represent agriculture or other industry and one (1) member shall represent environmental interest groups. A City Selection Committee organized in each County of the Valley pursuant to Article II (commencing with s50270) Chapter 1, Part 1, Division 1, Title 5 of the Government Code shall each appoint one (1) member to represent cities of that County. Each appointing body shall appoint an alternate member for each primary member appointed. CAC members must be bona-fide residents of any County within the District. Current voter registration and residential mailing address, inter alia, may be considered as evidence of residence. Determination of residence shall be at the sole discretion of the voting membership of the District's Governing Board. In addition CAC members shall be qualified as follows:

- A. Members appointed by the City Selection Committees may be persons duly elected to a public office.
- B. Agriculture or Industry members appointed by the respective Boards of Supervisors shall be representatives of legally established private enterprises operated for monetary profit within the Valley.
- C. Environmental members appointed by the respective Boards of Supervisors shall be representatives of recognized environmental interest groups.
- D. Members shall demonstrate interest by attending CAC meetings. Failure to attend three consecutive CAC meetings in one year's time without excuse shall be cause for disqualification. In those cases where an appointing authority has appointed an alternate member, that alternate member's attendance shall constitute attendance by the primary member. Granting excuse for attending CAC meetings shall be at the sole discretion of the CAC Chair.

TERM: Initial members appointed by each City Selection Committee shall serve terms of one (1) year from the date of appointment. Initial Environmental members appointed by each Board of Supervisors shall serve terms of two (2) years from the date of appointment. Initial Agriculture/Industry members appointed by each Board of Supervisors shall serve terms of three (3) years from the date of appointment. All subsequent appointments shall be for terms of three (3) years.

DUTIES: To receive public comments relating to the actions and decisions of the District and to assist the District in effecting the purpose of the Agreement.
