## What We Did in 2025

- **Trash Relief:** Helped families stuck with overflowing garbage during the Republic Services strike by providing dump vouchers to County residents.
- **Honor Veterans:** Put a clear policy in place to guide how and when we raise the POW/MIA flag with proper respect.
- **Smart Pause:** Temporarily halted new cannabis shops while setting fair guidelines that protect neighborhoods and support responsible businesses.
- **Cleaner Corridors:** Coordinated cleanup efforts along major I-5 ramps and made sure unhoused neighbors were offered real placement options.
- **Safer Parks:** Laid the groundwork for major upgrades and stronger security at seven County parks to make them safer and more welcoming.
- **Recovery Growing:** Secured funding to expand the Gospel Rescue Mission's recovery program so more people can rebuild their lives.
- **Pet Support:** Partnered with animal groups to offer more low-cost spay and neuter vouchers, helping families care for pets and reduce strays.
