A: The County marked a major milestone in developing the Be Well Campus, a new initiative focused on expanding mental health services.

Q: What is the Be Well Campus? A: It's a comprehensive mental health facility designed to improve access to care, crisis response, and long-term support for individuals facing mental health challenges.

Q: How much is being invested in the Be Well Campus?

A: The County is investing \$261.8 million, making it one of the region's largest mental health infrastructure projects.

Q: Why is this project significant?
A: It represents a major step toward improving mental health outcomes by providing essential services and reducing barriers to care for the community.

Q: What was the Collaborative Courts graduation ceremony on May 8th about?

A: Held at the historic Bob Hope
Theatre, the ceremony honored over
200 individuals who completed courtsupported recovery, rehabilitation, and
reentry programs. It celebrated their
personal achievements and highlighted
the impact of alternative court
programs focused on treatment and
support.

Q: Why are Collaborative Courts important?

A: Collaborative Courts offer a supportive alternative to incarceration by focusing on treatment and rehabilitation for individuals struggling with substance abuse or other issues. These courts aim to reduce recidivism and help participants successfully reintegrate into society. The graduation highlights San Joaquin County's commitment to justice through compassion, showing that rehabilitation and support can lead to long-term success for individuals and safer, stronger communities.
