**Board Approves Supervisor Rickman's Proposals to Provide District Five Funds in Support of Local Programs**

STOCKTON – At its Board meeting on Tuesday, June 16, 2026, the San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors approved Supervisor Rickman's proposals to provide dedicated District 5 Funds to several worthy programs serving the Tracy and Mountain House areas.

The Pregnancy Resource Center of Tracy (PRC of Tracy) will receive \$11,518 to cover costs for program materials needed to reach and serve clients in need with proper compassionate care and education while making vital decisions. The PRC of Tracy has been supporting women and families facing unplanned pregnancies in our community since 1985. As a non-profit CA Licensed Free Medical Clinic, they provide pregnancy tests, first trimester ultrasounds, birth/parenting education and material resources for their clients. They take a holistic approach of physical, spiritual and emotional assistance throughout pregnancy and through the subsequent 3 years of life.

SMAP Foundation Inc. (SMAP) will receive \$10,139 to cover costs for scouting equipment needs. SMAP is a nonprofit community organization supporting local Scouting America units; Scouting America Troop 2536G (Girls Troop), Scouting America Troop 536B (Boys Troop), and Cub Scout Pack 536 (Ages 5–11), recognizing their proven impact on character development, leadership skills, and community responsibility. Troop's 2536G, 536B, and Pack 536 are newly chartered and lacked essential gear and supplies. SMAP is dedicated to empowering youth and families through leadership development, civic engagement, cultural education, and community service. Their mission includes promoting unity, democratic values, and responsible citizenship, and empowers youth to become Strategic, Mindful, Athletic, and Passionate.

South Side Community Organization of Tracy (SSCO) will receive \$8,843 in support of organization needs. SSCO is a nonprofit serving the needs of the Tracy community, dedicated to promoting general welfare through education, a weekly meal program, and economic and cultural development. SSCO is seeking funds to enhance their meal program and upgrade their building to provide a safer, more functional, and welcoming space for community functions and events.

"These organizations serve a wide range of our community and reinforce my commitment to strengthening local organizations that make a difference in the lives of San Joaquin County residents," said District 5 Supervisor Robert Rickman. "These investments support programs that assist families and expecting mothers, develop future leaders through scouting, and ensure community members have access to essential services and support. Together, these efforts help build stronger, healthier, and more connected communities."
