Board Approves Supervisor Rickman's Proposals to Provide District Five Funds in Support of Local Programs

STOCKTON – At its Board meeting on Tuesday, August 18, 2026, the San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors approved Supervisor Rickman's proposals to provide dedicated District 5 Funds to two worthy programs serving our communities.

The Rotary Club of Mountain House will receive \$6,201 to acquire essential event materials and equipment to enhance the quality, accessibility, and overall impact of their programs serving the community. The organization is a community-driven nonprofit organization dedicated to service, connection, and cultural unity. They organize events and fundraisers throughout the year that bring together residents from diverse backgrounds while supporting local causes and initiatives.

"Mountain House Rotary continues to make a difference through its commitment to service and community. This funding will help strengthen its programs and support the important work Rotary members do for residents of Mountain House," Supervisor Robert Rickman stated.

Tracy Rampage Youth Cheer & Football will receive \$9,943 to address critical equipment, safety, and accessibility needs for their youth athletes. The Tracy Rampage Youth Cheer & Football is a volunteer-led and parent-driven community-based youth sports organization, dedicated to empowering the youth of Tracy through the sports of football and cheerleading. They serve approximately 150 youth athletes across multiple age divisions — from their youngest 'Starts' players to their 'Varsity' competitors — providing them with a structured, positive environment that promotes teamwork, discipline, sportsmanship, and physical fitness, developing well-rounded young people who excel not only in athletics, but also in character, academics, and community service. They are community-involved; members of the Tracy Chamber of Commerce, partners with local small businesses as vendors and purchases locally whenever possible, participate in local events and parades, bringing visibility and pride to youth athletes and their families.

"Tracy Rampage provides young athletes with opportunities to build confidence, learn teamwork and develop leadership skills. I am proud to support this organization and its continued investment in the youth of our community," Supervisor Robert Rickman stated.
