#### \$137 Million Investment in Behavioral Health: Be Well San Joaquin

The Board of Supervisors has approved an unprecedented \$137 million investment into behavioral health services through the "Be Well San Joaquin" initiative. This historic funding will transform how our county addresses mental health and substance use disorders by increasing capacity, expanding access, and strengthening care for all residents. ## STANDING STRONG ON LEGISLATIVE ISSUES







#### **Opposed: PG&E General Rate Case Increase**

The County has submitted a formal letter opposing PG&E's proposed rate increase. Rising energy costs place an undue burden on our families and businesses, and we are fighting to keep utility bills affordable.

#### **Tracy Courthouse Funding Deferred**

While we expressed strong support for keeping the Tracy Courthouse funding, the Governor's most recent Budget proposal has delayed it to a future fiscal year. We will continue to advocate for this vital infrastructure.

#### **Support: SB 712 – Classic Car Smog Check Exemption**

We're supporting SB 712, which passed out of the Senate Appropriations Committee. This bill provides exemptions for collector motor vehicles from smog checks—a win for car enthusiasts and preservationists alike.

#### Oppose: AB 470 - Carrier of Last Resort Mandate

The County has registered opposition to AB 470, which could threaten rural phone service by undermining traditional carrier obligations. The bill has moved forward from the Assembly Appropriations Committee.

#### **Support: AB 286 - Electric Rate Reduction**

We are supporting AB 286 to lower costs for San Joaquin County rate payers. I was able to meet with Assemblymember Gallagher to express our support. The bill is currently in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.
