Board Approves Annual Budget

Focused on Public Safety, Financial Stewardship, and Strategic Priorities

Supervisor Robert Rickman commented, "We are not just preparing for economic uncertainty-we are making sure County services stay strong, safe, and reliable. This year, more than half of our discretionary budget pays for the law and justice departments that keep our residents safe and ensure that we are able to hold people who break the law accountable in the justice system. We are backing that up with real investment: hiring more personnel, upgrading equipment, and ensuring that the brave men and women working to keep our communities safe have the tools they need to do the job."

Supervisor Rickman also addressed concerns about shifting costs in the face of a looming State budget crisis and economic uncertainty. "Time and again, we see Sacramento politicians balance their budgets with so-called 'creative' solutions that end up pushing costs down to counties like ours. It is unacceptable. San Joaquin County should not be left holding the bag for decisions made miles away. My priority is making sure local resources stay local-so we can fund the public safety, infrastructure, and essential services our communities actually depend on."

\$2.5 Million Grant Funding Available for San Joaquin County Community-Based and Non-County Organizations (CBO/NCO Funding)

New Online Portal to Submit Applications Available July 1-31, 2025

Grant funding is available for CBOs/NCOs based and providing services in San Joaquin County. Every year San Joaquin County awards one-time funding to Community Based/Non-County Organizations. San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors Adopts Stricter Fireworks Ordinance - New Rules Include Property Owners or Party Organizers that Use Illegal Fireworks

The Board of Supervisors adopted a new ordinance with stricter regulations on the use of fireworks in unincorporated areas of the County. The new rules aim to improve public safety, reduce fire hazards, and hold individuals more accountable for violations.

LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY: MAKING YOUR VOICE HEARD

PG&E

Per my request, the County has consistently registered opposition to PG&E rate increases, but this month we experienced a PG&E Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) in the southwest portion of our county. What started as a PSPS ended with an unplanned rebalance of the electrical grid, causing tens of thousands of residents to lose power in Tracy, Lathrop, and Manteca. Throughout this outrageous power outage and moving forward, I will continue to advocate for common sense solutions instead of punitive service interruptions from PG&E. I sent a letter to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) asking for a review of the PSPS, copying the Governor, our legislators, and the PG&E CEO. Shortly thereafter, PG&E asked for a meeting where South County Fire Authority Chief Randall Bradley and I argued on behalf of our local residents, ranchers, and businesses. Power was restored the next day.

Oppose: AB 470 As Amended - Carrier of Last Resort Mandate

The County, along with the California Farm Bureau Federation, remains opposed to Assembly Bill 470, as amended. AB 470 would dismantle core public obligations and accelerate the erosion of reliable, affordable telephone service - particularly in rural and high-risk areas. I believe we should not prioritize company convenience over consumer protection.

Support: SB 712 – Classic Car Smog Check Exemption

I continue to support SB 712, recently amended in the California State Senate. This bill provides exemptions for collector motor vehicles from smog checks—a win for car enthusiasts and preservationists alike.

Valley Link Sacramento Legislative Day

This month, as Chairman of the ValleyLink Board, I joined other ValleyLink leaders and met with legislators in Sacramento to promote this important rail project that will close a critical gap in the statewide rail system. ValleyLink will provide a clean, reliable alternative to congestion on Interstates 205 and 580 for more than 105,000 workers now commuting daily from their homes in San Joaquin County. It is expected to remove 33,000 cars off the Altamont Corridor, connect nearly 500 miles of commuter and intercity rail with more than 130 stations in the Northern California Megaregion, improve our air quality, and create jobs.
