#### **CAMP HOPE: Helping Local Children Heal from Trauma**

In honor of Domestic Violence Awareness Month, the San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors approved a combined contribution of \$20,000 to the San Joaquin County Family Justice Center Foundation to support Camp HOPE, a program that helps children and teens recover from the trauma of abuse or loss. Each Supervisor contributed \$4,000 from their district funds, expanding access for local youth to attend Camp HOPE in 2026 and bringing the county closer to establishing a permanent Camp HOPE program locally.

The nationally recognized, trauma-informed program provides mentorship, activities, and emotional support, helping children rebuild trust and self-esteem. The Board's support highlights San Joaquin County's ongoing commitment to collaboration, prevention, and recovery for families impacted by domestic violence.

#### SJCARES: A Year of Results for San Joaquin County

The Board of Supervisors joined the San Joaquin County Probation
Department to mark the first full year of the SJ CARES initiative — a bold step
toward bridging behavioral health, housing, and public safety in partnership.
In just 14 months, outreach teams made 4,400 contacts, engaging 770 people
across the county. 484 individuals were connected with services like medical
care, housing assistance, and behavioral-health treatment.
85 people transitioned off the streets, nearly one-third secured permanent
housing, and others reunited with family.

# LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY: MAKING YOUR VOICE HEARD

Another PG&E Rate Hike (OPPOSED)

Consistent with my previous positions, I wrote – <u>view my letter here</u> - to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to express my opposition to the Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E) 2027 General Rate Case (GRC) application and urged that they reject it. The CPUC held virtual Public Forums in October and will hold an inperson Public Forum in November to receive comments from PG&E customers regarding the utility's GRC application. Public Forums are an opportunity for PG&E customers to share input directly with the CPUC about PG&E's request to increase revenues to cover natural gas and electric operations, distribution, and generation costs for 2027–2030.

Although the next forum is being held in-person at the Hugh Burns State Building, 2550 Mariposa Mall, Suite #1036 (Assembly Room), Fresno, CA 93721 – on November 7, 2025, at 2 p.m. and 6 p.m., you can have your voice heard by:

#### **2025 Legislative Session**

The County advocated for and against several bills this legislative session and recently received a report from our legislative consultants. At the end of the first year of Sacramento's two-year legislative session, over 2,833 bills were introduced, with 863 bills having been signed, and 54 bills vetoed during the 2025 Legislative Session.

The Delta. The Delta Counties Coalition (San Joaquin County is a member) stopped the Governor's budget trailer bills to accelerate the regulatory process and override court decisions related to the Delta Tunnel plan. Proposition 4 allocation key developments include; \$3.3 billion approved by the Legislature and Governor, explicit tunnel neutral language in the Bond, and \$150 million for the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta to improve levees, not part of the agreement for this budget year's bond allocations.

<u>Prop 36.</u> Overwhelmingly supported by California voters, yet underfunded by Sacramento. The 2025-26 State Budget includes; \$50 million for behavioral health and \$15 million for public defenders to implement. California counties sought \$250 million for this purpose.

Looking ahead, the State faces a projected deficit exceeding \$10+ billion. Early 2026 will bring rapid budget adjustments, updates to trailer bills, and renewed discussions on unresolved measures.
