Recorder-Clerk Opens Satellite Office in Lathrop

On May 22, 2024, County Assessor-Recorder-Clerk Steve Bestolarides' office opened a satellite location inside Lathrop City Hall. The satellite location is designed to give south county residents access at a location that is closer and more convenient. The office provides services including copies of vital records (marriage, birth, and death certificates) and record legal size documents. The satellite office is open each Wednesday from 8:00 am to 3:30 pm.

The Recorder-Clerk's main office is located in the San Joaquin County administration building, located at 44 N. San Joaquin Street in Stockton, and is open weekdays from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm.
