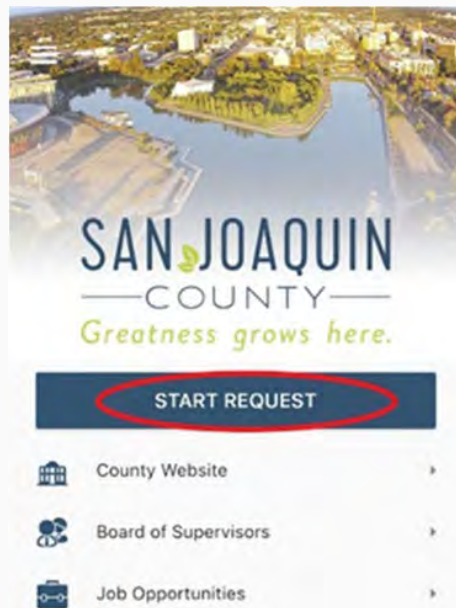


## My San Joaquin - Services App

Looking to report an issue with illegal dumping, county roads, or waterways? One easy way is to use the "My San Joaquin" app to place a service request with the appropriate county department.

Service Requests are reviewed within 24 hours or the next business day and routed to the appropriate department. Once a service request is submitted, you will be notified, via email, when the issue has been resolved.

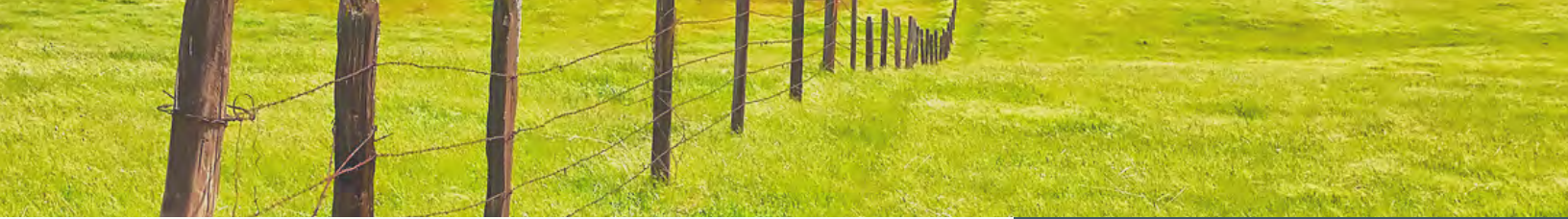

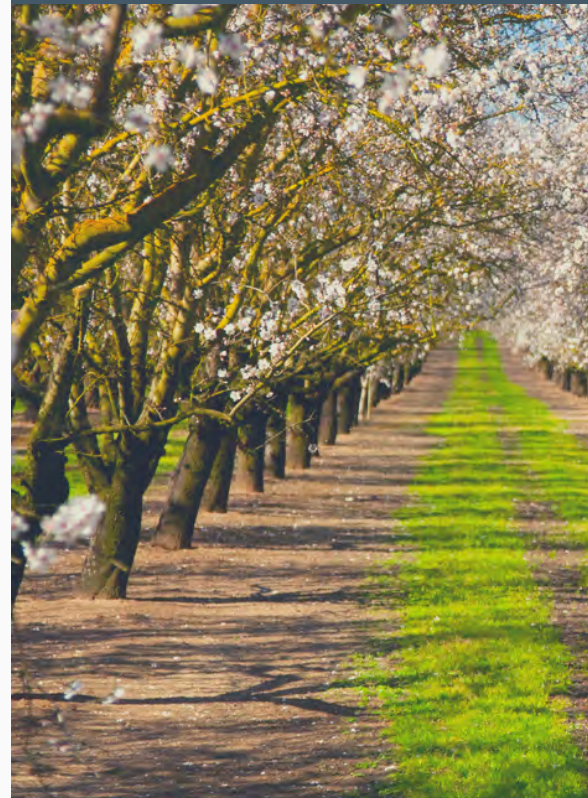
