ADOPT ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2, DIVISION 1, TITLE 4 TO UPDATE SECTION 4-1017 OPERATIONAL FEES (Said Ordinance Introduced and Waived on June 11, 2019)

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Board of Supervisors adopt the ordinance amending Chapter 2 of Division 1 of Title 4 of the Ordinance Code of San Joaquin County regarding the Section 4-1017 Operational Fees that was introduced and waived on June 11, 2019.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:

Pursuant to Title 4, the Community Development Director is the County Fire Warden and, with the San Joaquin County Bureau of Fire Prevention, is responsible for the administration and enforcement of the California Fire Code. The County Fire Warden may appoint deputies to assist in the enforcement of the Fire Code, such deputies shall include the Chiefs of all Fire Districts and their authorized representatives within the County.

In Section 4-1003 of Chapter 1 of Division 1 of Title 4 the County adopted the California Fire Code, 2016 Edition, with the following amendment: "Section 105.1.2 and 105.7 of Chapter 1 of the California Fire Code, 2016 Edition, are hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 105.1.2. 1. Operational Permits required by this Code shall be obtained from the County Fire Warden in such form, detail and procedures as the County Fire Warden may prescribe. Permit fees shall be paid prior to the issuance of such operational permits. Fees shall be set by a board resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Joaquin. Issued permits shall be kept on the premises designated therein at all times and shall be readily available for inspection by the County Fire Warden. Such permits shall be issued on an annual basis unless otherwise noted. If a rural fire protection district has established a Bureau of Fire Prevention, it may issue permits and collect fees subject to this Code if it complies with County procedures set forth pursuant to this section."

Since the County has a Bureau of Fire Prevention, it issues annual operational fire permits. An operational permit allows the applicant to conduct an operation or a business for which a permit is required by the California Fire Code. Section 4-1017 Operational Fees sets the operational fire permit fees.

To assist with the issuance of operational fire permits, the County entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with each of the 21 Fire Districts within the County. Pursuant to most of the MOUs in which the Fire District has agreed to provide services relating to Operational Fees within their jurisdictional boundaries, the County tracks the permits, collects fees, and is responsible for sending permit renewal and expiration notices. Accordingly, the County and the Districts share the fee for each permit; the County retains 25% and the District receives 75%.

For many years the Section 4-1017 Operational Fees were all set at \$95. In 2011 the fees were increased by \$5 to the current fee amount of \$100. Unfortunately, the hourly cost of the County Community Development San Joaquin County Fire Prevention Services Coordinator is approximately \$56.11 (this includes salary and benefits but not overhead or administrative costs). The average hourly cost of each Fire District Fire Professional is approximately \$40.60 (this includes salary and benefits but not overhead or administrative costs). Additionally, the hourly cost of utilizing a fire truck costs the Fire Districts approximately \$125 per hour. Generally, the Fire Districts staff the fire truck they utilize to perform inspections with three Fire Professionals to ensure that if an emergency occurs during the operational fire permit inspection, the truck and personnel are available to respond. Accordingly, most or all applications for operational fire permits currently exceed the cost of providing this service and as a result, operational fire permits are being processed and issued at a significant loss to the County and the participating Fire Districts.

Following the 2016-17 budget hearings, the County Administrator issued a memorandum to the Auditor-Controller (ACO) requesting an assessment of Countywide fees. Ultimately, that led to an audit of the Community Development Department's fees in January 2018. The ACO issued a report on its audit January 16, 2019. One objective of the audit was to determine whether existing fees should be adjusted. However, the ACO did not audit the Operational Fees because they stated that those fees were set by Board Resolution and Ordinance; specifically stating the Operational Fees were not audited because the "Fee is set by Ord. 4490, no change is recommended." Instead, the audit report concluded that the Community Development Department should complete a fee study, at which time the ACO would audit the time/fee study data and conclusions.

The Community Development Department has begun the process of hiring a consultant to undertake a time, material, and process study, which will include an analysis of all fire related fees, including Operational Fees, Construction Fees, and the Fire Facilities Fees. That study is expected to be concluded in the fall of 2019, at which time the Department, along with the ACO, will bring any recommendations fee adjustments to this Board.

¹ There are 21 Fire Districts in the County. Of those County Fire Districts, 9 receive 75%, 1 receives 100%, and 11 do not perform any Operational Fee services on behalf of the County (those services are not addressed in their MOU.)

However, due to the uniquely detrimental impact of the loss of revenue to the County and Fire Districts caused by the existing Operational Fees, the Community Development Department has opted to propose an increase of the Operational Fire fees prior to the completion of the time, materials, and process study. To do so, the Department performed a comparison of Operational Fees in the incorporated cities within the County as well as the following jurisdictions: Fresno, Merced, and Stanislaus Counties, and Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, which is the fire agency for Sacramento County.

Unfortunately, of the counties only Merced County had comparable Operational Fees. Each of the other counties utilized different methodologies in collecting fees for the Operational Fire services. The upcoming study will look at those methodologies to determine if they include best practices, but at this time those counties' fees could not be utilized. Additionally, the City of Stockton did not have a directly comparable fee. Instead, Stockton has a larger initial fee and then charges a lower annual fee. In order to account for these factors in the comparison study, and since many operational fire permits have a life of approximately 10 years, the Department took Stockton's lower annual fee and averaged it with 10% of the higher initial fee to create a weighted fee amount for the City of Stockton. We then averaged Stockton's weighted fee with the other Cities and the County of Merced. Additionally, a few fees were adjusted for consistency within the ordinance. The average fee has been rounded to the nearest \$5 to assist in splitting the fee between the County and the Fire District pursuant to each MOU. (ATTACHMENT A)

In addition to proposing an increased fee amount based on the comparison study, the Department recommends that the Operational Fees be adopted by Resolution instead of being part of the Title 4 text. This is consistent with other Department's fees and allows for a more efficient adoption by Resolution instead of ordinance, which requires two Board meetings and also requires that the fees do not go into effect for 30 days following adoption.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The proposed increased Section 4-1017 Operational Fees in the Resolution will result in approximately \$98,567.50² in total annual revenue. In MOUs that split the fees 75/25 this will result in approximately \$73,925.63 to the Fire Districts and approximately \$24,641.88 to the County. Currently, the efforts of the County and the Districts are not covered through the existing fees. The additional funds will assist in offsetting the General Fund dollars and District monies that are currently subsidizing the inspection and permit services provided by the County and the Districts.

<u>ACTION TO BE TAKEN FOLLOWING APPROVAL:</u>

Thirty (30) days after the date of adoption, the ordinance will become effective pursuant to Government Code Section 25123. Within fifteen (15) days after adoption, the Clerk will cause to be published a summary of the ordinance, shall make available to the public upon request a

certified copy of the ordinance, and post the ordinance pursuant to Government Code Section 25124. Thereafter, the adopted ordinance will be published in the San Joaquin County Ordinance Code. When the ordinance becomes effective, R-19-80 the Resolution to Adopt a Fee Schedule Pursuant to Section 4-1017 Operational Fees, Chapter 2, Division 1, Title 4 will also become effective.

Additionally, the Community Development Department will continue to move forward with a time, materials, and process study on fire fees and work cooperatively with County Fire Districts to update the existing MOUs to ensure that fees are appropriate for each participating agency's needs. That study is expected to be completed in the fall of 2019.

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2, DIVISION 1, TITLE 4 TO UPDATE SECTION 4-1017 OPERATIONAL FEES

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Joaquin ordains as follows:

SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES, TITLE 4, DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 2, SECTION 4-1017 is amended as follows:

TITLE 4 -- PUBLIC SAFETY

DIVISION 1 – FIRE PREVENTION

CHAPTER 2 - FEES

<u>SECTION 4-1017.</u> <u>OPERATIONAL FEES.</u> The <u>Board shall set by Resolution following fees to be shall be</u>-charged at the time of applying for required operational fire permits as required by the California Fire Code 2016 Edition <u>that are and shall be</u>-annual, unless otherwise <u>identified in the Resolution noted.</u>
