Operational Area Presentations/Reports

Chiefs of Emergency Services

Co-Chair Rickman – Had a question regarding the signature pages for plans and wanted to ensure they were updated with the appropriate Directors. Co-Chair Rickman also discussed a recent town hall hosted with San Joaquin County Public Works regarding Corral Hollow Creek and the recent flooding. The event discussed potential mitigation for consistent flooding in the area. Co-Chair Rickman announced the County Board of Supervisors (BOS) decision in March to move Office of Emergency Services (OES) to a standalone department reporting directly to the BOS. Co-Chair Rickman also congratulated Vice-Chair Heyer on a recent wedding and complimented OES on the handling of the recent disasters.

City Representatives

Lodi – Chief Johnson identified the City was working on plans for railway responses, including identifying their current capabilities. Chief Johnson advised this planning would ultimately lead to a full-scale exercise. City of Lodi is also monitoring local waterways due to high water on the Mokelumne River. Chief Johnson reported continued Fentanyl OD issues.

Ripon – Mr. Werner provided an update on the City waste water treatment plant that had been effected by the January and March storms.

Stockton – Chief Edwards reported that the City had moved into, and was working out of, their new Emergency Operations Center. They have been having issues filling positions in their EOC and are in need of training. Chief Edwards introduced Tim Romero, the new City Emergency Manager. Chief Edwards stated the City was working on updating plans over the next year, including evacuation and alert and warning.
