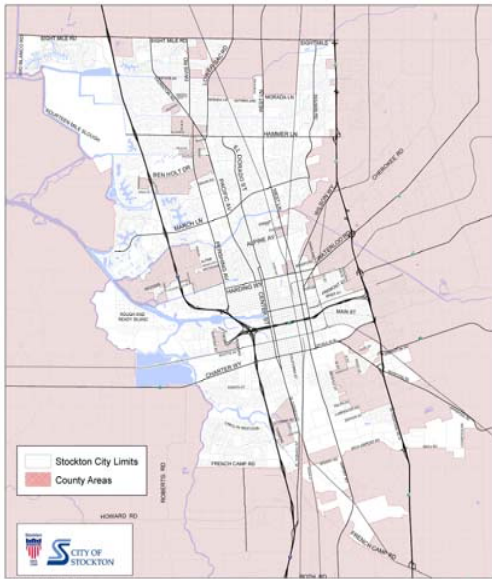

Illegal Firework Education Program

Fireworks in SJC

In the unincorporated areas of San Joaquin County, all fireworks, including “Safe and Sane” are **ILLEGAL**.

Each city has its own laws related to the possession and use of “Safe and Sane” fireworks. Contact your local fire prevention division to inquire about specific ordinances.

2017 Fireworks Enforcement:

ZERO Tolerance for the sale, possession and use of **ILLEGAL** fireworks.

Sale, use and/or possession of **ILLEGAL** fireworks not bearing State Fire Marshal’s seal is a crime punishable by up to 1 year in jail and/or a \$1,000 fine.

If a fire is caused by the use of any **ILLEGAL** fireworks, arson charges may be brought against the user.

Using **ILLEGAL** fireworks around small child could result in child endangerment charges.

Firework Safety



Fireworks are an iconic and festive way to celebrate the Fourth of July. They can however be dangerous if used improperly.

Consumers should purchase only State Marshal-approved, *Safe and Sane* fireworks, from licensed fireworks stands.

Look for the seal!

Aerial fireworks shows require state and locally issued permits and must be performed by a licensed pyrotechnician.

Safety Tips for using Safe and Sane Fireworks

- Read and follow all fireworks warnings and instructions
- Light one at a time, then move away quickly
- Keep others at a safe distance
- Keep a bucket of water, garden hose or fire extinguisher handy
- Use fireworks outdoors only, away from buildings, vehicles, dry grass and other flammable objects
- Purchase only from legitimate organizations authorized to sell
- Never point or throw fireworks at anyone
- Never hold lit fireworks in your hand
- Do not attempt to “re-light” or “fix” a dud firework
- Never experiment or make your own fireworks
- Dispose of fireworks properly by soaking them in water and then disposing them in your trashcan.
- Stay away from illegal explosives
