

SUBJECT: Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency Report on the Exclusive

Emergency Ambulance Provider Contract Compliance for American Medical

Response (AMR) for March and April 2008.

The EMS Agency Report on the Exclusive Emergency Ambulance Provider Contract Compliance for AMR for the months of March and April 2008 represents the twelfth opportunity to report on AMR's performance under the five year emergency ambulance service agreement. The AMR contract establishes accountability for meeting specific standards and provides the EMS Agency with complete access to data and information on AMR's operational, clinical, and administrative performance. EMS Agency staff has vetted AMR's computer aided dispatch (CAD) data in preparing the compliance report.



AMR's combined response time compliance for all ambulance zones met or exceeded the 90 percentile standard set by the County, 94.41% for March and 94.33% for April.

AMR is authorized under the provisions of the ambulance contract to increase patient charges by 4.9% on the first

day of May in the years 2008, 2009, and 2010. The contract also specifies that AMR may request approval to "for an increase in patient charges to mitigate unforeseen financial impacts of events that are beyond [AMR's] control". In May 2008, AMR submitted a request to increase the per loaded mile charge to mitigate the 40% rise in fuel costs in the past 12 months. The EMS Agency approved AMR's request to increase the per-loaded mile charge from \$19.93 to \$24.83 effective July 1, 2008.



#### AMR SAN JOAQUIN RECEIVES NATIONAL ACCREDITATION

112<sup>th</sup> Ambulance Service Provider in the Nation, and 14<sup>th</sup> in California to be Recognized by the Commission on Accreditation of Ambulance Services

(San Joaquin County, CA) – American Medical Response (AMR), San Joaquin Counties 911 ambulance service provider, was recently accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Ambulance Services (CAAS). In order to obtain CAAS accreditation, AMR had to demonstrate that it provided a higher caliber of emergency medical services than is typically required by state or local licensing agencies.

On March 28, 2008, AMR became the 112<sup>th</sup> ambulance service provider in the country, and the 14<sup>th</sup> in California, to successfully complete the CAAS voluntary review process. The review process included a comprehensive application and an extensive on-site review by national experts in emergency medical services (EMS). In addition, LIFECOM, the emergency medical dispatch center for AMR and local EMS agencies, was also reviewed by CAAS experts, and determined to have achieved the organization's "gold standard" of service.

"To be recognized by CAAS is certainly a tremendous honor, but also a clear demonstration that AMR crews, dispatchers and support personnel are truly dedicated to providing the best emergency medical services possible to the citizens of San Joaquin County," said Barry Elzig, General Manager for AMR San Joaquin.

CAAS is a non-profit organization which was established to encourage and promote quality patient care in America's medical transportation system. The primary focus of the Commission's standards is high-quality patient care. This is accomplished by establishing national standards which not only address the delivery of patient care, but also the ambulance service's total operation and its relationships with other agencies, the general public, and the medical community. The Commission's standards often exceed state or local licensing requirements (see www.caas.org).
