

SUBJECT: Report on Exclusive Emergency Ambulance Provider Contract Compliance

The EMS Agency Report on the Exclusive Emergency Ambulance Provider Contract Compliance for AMR for the months of July and August, 2011, provides an in depth review of AMR's performance. The County's contract with AMR establishes accountability for meeting specific standards and provides the EMS Agency with complete access to data and information on AMR's operational, clinical, and administrative performance.



AMR's July and August 2011, response time compliance for all ambulance zones met or exceeded the 90 percentile standard set by the County with 94.1% for July and 93.7% for August.

AMR's second compliance report for the new five-year contract continues at

combined response performance levels typical of recent years, and also continues the recent trend in meeting compliance in each of the eleven (11) sub zones. For July, AMR exceeded compliance standards in all but two subzones and in August AMR exceeded compliance standards in all subzones.


