

SUBJECT: Report on Exclusive Emergency Ambulance Provider Contract Compliance

The EMS Agency Report on the Exclusive Emergency Ambulance Provider Contract Compliance for AMR for the months of September and October, 2011, provides an in depth review of AMR's performance. The County's contract with AMR establishes accountability for meeting specific standards and provides the EMS Agency with complete access to data and information on AMR's operational, clinical, and administrative performance.



AMR's September and October 2011, response time compliance for all ambulance zones met or exceeded the 90 percentile standard set by the County with 93.1% for September and 92.4% for October.

AMR's third compliance report for the new five-year contract continues at

combined response performance levels typical of recent years, and also continues the recent trend in meeting compliance in each of the eleven (11) sub zones. AMR exceeded compliance standards in all but one subzone for both months.


