

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SUBJECT: Report on Exclusive Emergency Ambulance Provider Contract Compliance

The EMS Agency Report on the Exclusive Emergency Ambulance Provider Contract Compliance for AMR for the months of September and October, 2013, provides an in depth review of AMR's performance. The County's contract with AMR establishes accountability for meeting specific standards and provides the EMS Agency with complete access to data and information on AMR's operational, clinical, and administrative performance.



AMR's September and October 2013, combined response time compliance for all ambulance zones met or exceeded the 90 percentile standard set by the County with 91.55% for July and 91.93% for August.

AMR's latest compliance report continues the third year of the second five-year contract period.

Compliance continues at combined response performance levels typical of recent years. AMR exceeded compliance standards in seven (7) of the eleven subzones in September and eight (8) of the eleven subzones in October.


