INSTITUTIONS

RECREATIONAL HEALTH

Objective - To assure that all public recreational waters, swimming pools

Workload - Approximately 617 pools/spas/natural bathing areas.

SMOKING ENFORCEMENT

Objective - To protect public health through education and enforcement of State and Local anti-smoking laws.

MILK AND DAIRY

Objective - To ensure safe and wholesome milk by inspection and quality control for dairy farm sanitation and milk grading.

Workload - 111 Grade A dairies, 1 milk dispenser unit.

LIQUID WASTE

Objective - To prevent the spread of disease and environmental contamination by ensuring proper handling and disposal of sewage effluent.

Workload - Approximately 410 septic permits/consultations; 33 treatment plants; 116 pumper trucks and yards; 1655 chemical toilets.

SMALL PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS

Objective - To protect public health and prevent disease by assuring small public water supplies are at all times safe, potable and available in adequate quantity.

Authority - California Health & Safety Code Sections 116330-116345, and 116800.

Workload - 495 small public water systems.

WELL SYSTEMS

Objective - To ensure safe and potable domestic water supplies and protect groundwater quality through regulation of well construction, repair and destruction.

Authority - California Water Code Section 13801; Ordinance Code of SJC Sections 5-4303, 9-1115; Municipal Codes of Lodi, Manteca, Tracy, Escalon, Ripon.

Workload - 1,005 well, pump and boring permits.

MEDICAL WASTE

Objective - To protect the general public, health care facility and solid waste management personnel from injury and exposure to pathogenic organisms in medical wastes.

Authority - California Health & Safety Code Section 117620.

Workload - 59 medical waste facilities.

SOLID WASTE

Objective - To protect public health and the environment by regulating the storage, collection, transportation and disposal of solid waste.
