Please be advised that the San Joaquin County Environmental Health Department (EHD) received and approved a Transfer Processing Report (TPR) amendment to the Solid Waste Facility Permit for the Lovelace Transfer Station. The EHD is the Solid Waste Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) for this facility. The LEA is certified by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) to enforce state laws and regulations at solid waste sites in San Joaquin County.

Description of Project and LEA's Determination

Lovelace Transfer Station is a 15-acre existing transfer station located at 2323 Lovelace Road West of Union Road, North of Manteca. On October 23, 2025, the LEA received a Solid Waste Facility Permit package from the San Joaquin County Department of Public Works applying for a TPR amendment.

The amendment proposes the establishment of a materials exchange program. A collection site will be designated for the donation and collection of goods that are still usable and hold some value. Acceptable items include, but are not limited to, furniture, small appliances, electronics, and household goods. Donations made to the designated drop-off area will be available for community members to take at no cost.

The purpose of the materials exchange program is to support the County's waste diversion and source reduction goals by minimizing landfill-bound materials, promoting reuse, conserving resources, and advancing circular economic practices within the County's Integrated Waste Management System.

The proposed changes will not affect any other aspect of the facility operation and will allow the facility to operate at a higher level of efficiency.

The EHD finds that the proposed change is exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Transfer/Processing Facilities and does not conflict with the terms and conditions of the Solid Waste Facility Permit (SWFP). The EHD approved the amendment on October 28, 2025.
