PUBLIC NOTICE- 30-DAY PUBLIC REVIEW & PUBLIC HEARING
DRAFT 2026-27 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

The County of San Joaquin has prepared a draft of the 2026-2027 Annual Action Plan which represents the second program year of the Consolidated Plan cycle (July 1, 2026 - June 30, 2027). The Annual Action Plan details specific projects to be funded with U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funding allocated to San Joaquin County for the unincorporated areas and the cities of Escalon, Lathrop, Manteca, Ripon, and Tracy that participate in the "Urban County". The projects detailed in the draft Annual Action Plan are to be funded with 2026-27 allocations that are estimated to be: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) \$2,983,745, HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME) \$976,847, and Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) \$262,234. In addition to the annual allocations received for these programs, the County will include up to \$500,000 of Program Income received from previous years' CDBG activities and up to \$500,000 of HOME Program Income. Funds will address housing and non-housing community development needs identified in the 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan.
