County of San Joaquin Substantial Amendment #1 to the 2020-2025 Consolidated Plan and 2020-21 Annual Action Plan

The following is a summary and draft language that amends the 2020-2025 Consolidated Plan and 2020-2021 Annual Action Plan.

Background

The County of San Joaquin's federal Consolidated Plan details the funding strategy for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG for the fiscal year period 2020 - 2025. The Annual Action Plan details each year within the 5-year Consolidated Plan and outlines the implementation of annual funding, which is developed through significant public input, analyses, and planning.

On March 27th, 2020, Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES) to support preparation for and response to the community impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and identified additional funding for the County of San Joaquin through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program which will be referred to as "CDBG-CV" funds. The County received and allocated its CV-1 dollars during the regular planning process of the 2020/2021 Action Plan. The County received an additional allotment of CDBG-CV3 funds in the amount of \$1,753,673 in order to prevent, prepare for or respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The City's Citizen Participation Plan (CPP) describes the efforts that the County will take to encourage its residents to participate in developing these plans. It also provides requirements for public process when a "substantial amendment" to the Annual Action Plan is proposed. The following changes constitute a substantial amendment and require public notice as described in the CPP:

- An allocation or re-allocation of more than \$500,000.
- A significant change to an activity's proposed beneficiaries or persons served.
- Funding of a new activity not previously described or deletion of an activity in the Action Plan.

However, due to COVID-19, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has issued guidance that that waives the Citizen Participation Plan requirements for entitlement recipients, provided that (1) no fewer than five days are provided for public comment and that (2) reasonable notice and the opportunity to comment is provided. The County has updated their CPP to allow for these HUD waivers and will be utilizing them for this Amendment as described above.

Proposed Substantial Amendments

The County is proposing the following activities as an amendment to the 2020-2021 Annual Action Plan in order to allocate the funding provided by CDBG-CV3 through the CARES Act.

- 1. Town Center Studios Adding Funds
- 2. Meals on Wheels Program Adding Funds
- 3. St. Mary's Facility Improvements New Project
- 4. Subsistence Payment Program Adding Funds
- 5. Emergency Shelter Facility Improvements in Manteca New Project
- 6. Emergency Shelter Facility in Tracy New Project

Public Process

The County of San Joaquin is providing notice of a five-day public comment period as part of the HUD public participation exemption process from April 15, 2021 and ending May 20, 2021. Additionally, one public hearing will be held to provide opportunities for public comment:
