WHY: Dads matter. Father involvement improves child wellbeing, happiness, social, and academic success. Research shows that having a dad present in a child's life helps with many things, including:

- School readiness and behavior (confidence, patience, and curiosity)
- Child development (verbal, cognitive, and motor)

- Security, confidence, and attachment
- Development of empathy
- Overall positive life outcomes and life decision-making as an adult
