NOTICE

of Proposed Service Charge Increase & Public Hearing

May 5, 2020

Dear Property Owner:

You are receiving this Notice because you own property within County Service Area 44 Zone G (District), which is a special district administered by San Joaquin County (County). The District provides sewer service to the properties within the District's boundaries. The Department of Public Works is advising you of a proposed increase to the rates that you pay for sewer service and the Public Hearing regarding the increases.

The annual charges you pay to the District are property related fees collected as part of your property tax bill. The fees fund labor for operation and maintenance, electricity, permits, and administration costs associated with the services. Your rates have only had one 5% increase (2007) since the District was established in 2004. During that time, the County's costs for this service have increased and an adjustment to your rates is necessary to keep revenues in line with expenses and provide for capital replacement.

District fees are a flat rate charge based on the Single Family Equivalent (SFE) unit. This is the level of service received by the average single family residence. The proposed charges, if approved, will be effective fiscal year 2020-21 through 2024-2024. Beyond this five-year period, the charges will continue at the 2024-2025 rate until district financial conditions justify a rate reduction or another rate increase is approved. The service charges are annual and will continue indefinitely for the purpose of covering all the necessary expenses to operate, maintain and replace the District's facilities for services.

^{*}Parcels with one single family home = 1 SFE. Parcels with two dwelling units = 1.7 SFE. Vacant parcels = 0.3 SFE.

The San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors approved forgiveness of the district's loan debt contingent upon approval of the proposed rate increase. They will consider adoption of the increase at a Public Hearing on:

Any written protests must be received by the San Joaquin County Public Works Department office at 1810 E. Hazelton Ave., Stockton, CA 95205 by 5:00 PM on July 6, 2020, or submitted at the Public Hearing prior to the close of the hearing.

If a rate increase is not passed, service levels within the District will need to be reduced to generate cost savings. The following cost reduction measures may be implemented:

- Reduction of after-hours and weekend service calls
- Reduction of regular maintenance of the system
- Postponement of equipment replacement

Dramatically reduced service levels could lead to operational issues, possibly resulting in State receivership and/or privatization of your system.
