Project Background

- Funded by a Caltrans Sustainable Transportation Planning Grant
- Robust community engagement is critical to project success
- Understand the community's needs for transportation investment
- Develop a plan consistent with the community's vision that aligns with regional and local transportation goals



Boggs Tract Sustainable Community Transportation Plan Area







Project Overview

Boggs Tract Community:

- Residential neighborhood at the southwest fringe of City of Stockton next to the Port of Stockton
- Neighborhood bounded by industrial land use zone, railroad tracks and freeways





Project Goals


Develop a community transportation plan that:


- Is safe, sustainable and efficient
- Supports public health, environmental justice, environmental conditions (GHG) and quality of life
- Enhances livability within community through alternative transportation improvements
- Preserves the community's distinctive character
- Prioritizes identified transportation improvements for implementation
- Identifies sources of funding



Boggs Tract Community Demographics

Population of 7,624 (2019)







Travel Behavior

- Approximately 95% of workers 16 and over drive to work
- About 20% of those who drive carpool
- 1% to 2% ride public transit
- Less than 1% walk or bike to work




Collision Data

- Data for collisions was collected for 2015 to 2020
- Two collisions resulted in fatalities
 - One involved a pedestrian on Washington Street due to pedestrian violation
 - One at the intersection of Church Street/Garfield Street due to speed



Collisions by Violation Category



Collision Data

- Speed and improper turning account for almost 50% of all collisions
- Combined the data on a map to better understand if there are any underlying common issues:
 - Speed along the same roadways
 - Improper turning at same locations







Collision Data - Preliminary Insight

- Speed is observed more frequently on some roadways:
 - Church Street provides direct access to Stockton
 - Fresno Avenue is a main arterial through the neighborhood with less residential driveways
 - Scott Avenue is on the outskirts with less residential driveways
- Improper turning is observed more frequently at some intersections:
 - Los Angeles Avenue/Washington Street
 - Los Angeles Avenue/Scott Avenue



Traffic Calming

Heavy Truck Traffic

Greatness grows here.

- Truck route review for Boggs Tract
 - Requires coordination between San Joaquin County and City of Stockton
 - Assess current truck routes and better understand truck patterns (pre-COVID)
 - Ensure roads are designated appropriately
- Possible coordination with SJ Valley Air Pollution Control District and CA Air Resources Board
 - AB 617 aims to reduce air pollution and improve public health
 - Opportunity to collaborate on a comprehensive truck study for Boggs Tract



Traffic Calming

Speeding

Portable Radar Speed Feedback Trailer

Coordination with Law Enforcement

Speed Hump Program

- Reduces speed when installed on appropriate streets:
 - Low speed residential streets
- Review and approval on case-by-case basis
- Implementation process:
 - Petitioner makes written request
 - Evaluation by staff and emergency responders
 - Consultation, approval and signatures from neighborhood and residents affected

State Route 4 Opportunity

- State Route (SR) 4 traverses diagonally from I-5 to Navy Drive over Boggs Tract
- Space under SR 4 owned and maintained by Caltrans
- Open space under structures between South Fresno Avenue and Ventura Avenue
- There are requirements for lease of Caltrans air space (review and approval)
- Opportunity for creation of a community space










Design Precedents Chicano Park San Diego, CA

- Park created in 1971
- Restored again in 2012


- 7 acres

History


- Located on Belmont Ave underneath SR 180
- Started in 2001
- Lowell community garden added in 2012

History


- 1993

Located and confluence of US 50 and I-5

Features

• 500 parking spaces and vegetation

Oakland History

• Constructed 2020 along Fruitvale Avenue under I-880


- Provides Park and Ride areas
- Electric Vehicle charging stations
- Fencing

I-5 Colonnade History

• Mountain Bike Skills Park developed in 2007

Features

- 2 acres of Mountain bike trails for different skills and techniques
- Dirt jumping section, pump track, practice track
- Trails with signage

Burnside History

- Developed 1990
- Maintained by volunteers

NoMa Washington, DC and Wabash Chicago, IL





NoMa History

- Started in 2016
- Installed by the District Department of Transportation to increase safety

Features

• Different lighting projects featured within the area

Wabash History

• Started in 2019

- LED lights that change according to surrounding features
- Intention is to put lights on entire length of the street in the city

• Opened in 2018
