These dates reflect San Joaquin County Registrar of Voters (ROV) administrative deadlines.

Measure Consolidation Deadline Information

The administrative deadlines provided in this measure consolidation calendar have been implemented and are necessary to meet vendor and print deadlines for the County Voter Information Guide. Resolutions requesting election services and measure consolidation with this scheduled election must be filed in person with the Registrar of Voters (ROV) and should be filed no later than **5:00 p.m. on January 19, 2026**, to ensure seamless processing by the ROV.

*10 Day Public Examination Period

During the public examination period provided for in this calendar, a complete copy of the materials filed by a jurisdiction, as well as any arguments and rebuttals submitted thereafter will be available for public review in the Registrar of Voters' office located at 44 North San Joaquin Street, Suite 350, Stockton, CA 95202 during regular business hours. January 19 (E-134)	Administrative Deadline to File Resolution Administrative deadline to file the resolution requesting election services and measure consolidation with the Registrar of Voters (ROV).

March 5 (E-89)	Rebuttals to Arguments For and Against Filing Deadline (250 Word Limit) *10-Day Public Examination Period: March 6 – March 15 <i>Elections Code §§ 9167, 9285, 9286, 9317</i> County Counsel/City Attorney Impartial Analysis Filing Deadline (500 Word Limit) *10-Day Public Examination Period: March 6 – March 15 <i>Elections Code §§ 9160, 9280, 9313, 9314, 9500</i>
June 2 (E-0)	Election Day All polling places are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. for drop-off or in-person voting. Mailed ballots must be postmarked by this date. <i>Elections Code §§ 1000, 14212</i>
July 2 (E+30)	Official End of Canvass of the Election The Registrar of Voters Office certifies election results; the governing bodies consolidated with this election receive a certified statement of the votes. <i>Elections Code §§ 15301, 15372, 15375</i>
