Election on the Question of Whether Members of the Mountain House City Council in Future Elections Are to be Elected By-District, From District, or At-Large

If Measure "D" passes, the City of Mountain House will be incorporated and five members of the City Council, which shall consist of a directly elected mayor and four city council members, will be elected at large. By law, any resolution of the San Joaquin Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) ordering an incorporation subject to an election shall also provide for the election on the question of whether members of the City Council in future elections are to be elected by-district, from district, or at-large.

A "By-District" election means only the people who live in a particular district may run for a seat on the City Council to represent that district. Only the voters of that particular district may vote for a City Council representative for that district. The individual elected is the City Council representative for that district.

A "From District" election means only the people who live in a particular district may run for a seat on the City Council to represent that district. Voters of the entire city may vote for all City Council members running for election. The individual elected is the City Council representative for that district.

An "At-Large" election means that anyone who lives in the City may run for a seat on the City Council without regard to district boundaries. Voters of the entire City may vote for all City Council members running for the election. The individuals elected are the City Council representatives for the entire City.
