San Joaquin County Voter Roll Updates

- The San Joaquin County Registrar of Voters (ROV) recently provided the Board of Supervisors with a Q1 2023 report which overviewed updates to the County's voter rolls.
- Voter rolls are constantly changing as new voters register and existing registrants move, change their name, pass away or otherwise become ineligible. One of the ROV's primary responsibilities is tracking these changes on a daily basis and researching any anomalies for correction.
- In the first three months of 2023, the ROV updated over 38,000 voter records according to California law based on the following criteria:
 - At the voter's request
 - Death
 - The voter moved to an address outside the County's jurisdiction
 - Felony conviction per state law
 - Adjudication of mental incapacity per state law
- In addition, the ROV reviewed voter records at residences where more than 10 people reside at the same address; were born over 100 years ago; or reportedly live at a business address or a temporary living facility address (e.g. restaurant, migrant camp, rehabilitation center). The ROV is also required to take certain steps to correct voter information where the contact information may be incomplete or incorrect on any submitted voter registration cards (VRC's).
- There were approximately 2,000 voters of the nearly 400,000 registered voters in San Joaquin County that, based on the 2020 voter roll data, fell under one of these categories. While the number may fluctuate day to day due to a number of factors, it is consistently declining.
- The ROV uses the following methods to identify and/or remove voters who may need their voter information updated:
 - At the voters request:
 - In writing
 - o Submission of a new voter registration card

- Notices that can be forwarded with a pre-addressed, postage-paid return card are sent to registrants whose address may have changed. These cards are called a Voter Notification Card (VNC), 2225 (b) card for in State moves, 2225 (c) card for out of state moves;
 - If the voter returns the card, their record is either updated with the new address or deleted if the voter moved out of the jurisdiction;
 - If the voter does not return the card, states like California have the option to designate the registrant inactive if they have not voted in the last two federal elections.
- Pre-election residency cards are sent out 90 days prior to any primary election, this is another method used for updating the voter rolls, if the voter returns the card with new information the Registrar of Voter's office will update the voter's file.
- The Registrar of Voter's office receives several lists from outside entities for updating the voter rolls (e.g. DMV, Department of Corrections, Public Health).

Concerns Regarding Joaquin County Voter Rolls: Comparative Analysis Between 2020 Master Voter File Submitted by Sheriff's Office and Current Master Voter File

Background

The San Joaquin County Registrar of Voters (ROV) office was presented with a copy of the 2020 master voter file that highlighted various concerns regarding potential irregularities. ROV has reviewed the information provided and addressed the areas of concern to the fullest extent allowed by the California Elections Code. When appropriate, registrations have been cancelled. ROV will continue to monitor the voter rolls and update as necessary to ensure they accurately reflect the data available to the Department.

The Registrar of Voters staff examined each voter record that was flagged and provided an updated status. The same techniques used to provide the updated status during this analysis are also utilized daily to update the master voter file, as new information is received from reporting agencies that coordinate with the Registrar of Voters office.


The National Voters Registration Act mandates that the ROV in conjunction with the Secretary of State's office complete voter removal programs **not later than 90 days prior to the date of a primary or general election for Federal office (see also EC 2220)**. Any claims or investigation into the current master voter file would be premature up and until after December 6, 2023, as the ROV's efforts to maintain the voter rolls are ongoing until such time. For future requests for claims or investigations into the master voter file, it is recommended that the requestor use the master voter file reported to the Secretary of State's office as per California Elections Code 2187 at E-15 days before an election.



Clarification Analysis


- Multiple Registered Voters at Restaurants: 3400 Wagner Heights Road (O'Connor Woods) and 3601 Pacific Ave (UOP) are not restaurants. These addresses were listed along with the data that identified multiple registered voters at restaurants.
- Voters With 1850 Birthyear: These voters were registered prior to a birthdate being required. This is a diminishing number that was 93 voters in 2020 and is currently 67 voters.
- Place of Birth Concern: Place of birth is not required to register to vote, per elections code 2154 (d).
- Under 18-Year-Old Voter Concerns: Pre-registration of 16–17-year-olds is permitted, the pre-registration remains inactive until their 18th birthday, per elections code 2155.3.
- Assumed Name Error Concerns: Per Elections Code 2153 and 2154, the elections official shall make every attempt to contact the voter to correct the missing information on a registration affidavit and shall assume that certain information provided under penalty of perjury is correct unless the voter notifies the election office otherwise.
- **Duplicate Voters:** In 2020, the VoteCal Statewide Database was tracking voters that were updating their voter records, which caused the old record to remain on the voter rolls. VoteCal has restructured how these records appear on the database, and San Joaquin County has zero duplicate voters on the current voter rolls.








Current status of residences with multiple registered voters

Current status of nursing facilities with multiple registered voters













Current status of multiple registered voters at shelters










Status of voters registered at University of Pacific Library






How many registered voters are listed as being over 100 years old, and what is their status?

Voter Registration Cancellation

Voter registration is permanent for life, unless canceled by the Secretary of State or the county elections official. The cancellation of registration can be requested by the registered voter or done for specific reasons such as mental incompetency, imprisonment for felony conviction, death, or ineligibility to vote.

The county elections official is responsible for canceling the registration in most cases, while the Secretary of State may do so for specific reasons.

Section 2201 of the California Elections Code outlines the cases where registration can be canceled.

This section is effective until January 1, 2024, and will be repealed on that date.

Voter File Maintenance Procedures

Reasons for cancelling a voter registration

- Signed, written request of registered individual
- Mental incompetency of registered individual is legally established by a judge
- Proof of imprisonment for a felony conviction
- Certified copy of judgement directing cancellation
- Upon death of person registered
- Pre-election residency confirmation card is returned as undeliverable
- Official confirmation voter has registered in another state
- Upon receipt of proof that individual is otherwise ineligible to vote

San Joaquin County ROV

- Anytime a voter has registered or re-registered, a voter notification card is sent confirming their voter file (tan card)
- Anytime a third-party change of address is submitted, we notify the voter with a notification card to confirm the change (white card)
- 90 days before every primary election our office sends out a notification card to every voter to confirm their residential address (white card)
- If voter has not voted in an election within the preceding 4 years and nothing has changed, an alternate residency confirmation card will be sent (white card)
