Protect Local Taxpayers and Repair Our Schools

Vote Yes on Measure T to repair our schools with the reassurance of strict taxpayer protections and no projected increase in tax rates to be levied each year.

Measure T puts taxpayers first:

- **100% stays local.** Every dollar is legally required to be spent on projects for our local schools. Funds cannot be taken by the State and spent elsewhere.
- **No salaries. No pensions. No exceptions.** Measure T funds cannot be used for administrators' salaries, pensions, or benefits.
- **Strict accountability.** Mandatory annual audits by independent auditors, ongoing oversight by local taxpayers, and full public disclosure of all spending. These are legal requirements, not promises.

Making repairs now costs far less than waiting. Every year we delay, repairs get more expensive, and taxpayers pay the difference.

Measure T will make critical repairs, including:

- **Aging infrastructure:** Deteriorating buildings, plumbing, leaky roofs, and inefficient heating, ventilation, and air-conditioning systems.
- **Career training facilities:** Modern labs, classrooms, and equipment preparing students for in-demand career fields such as healthcare, agricultural sciences, and skilled trades.
- **Student and staff safety:** campus fencing, cameras, intruder protection, emergency communication tools, smoke detectors, fire alarms, and sprinklers.
