I retired from South San Joaquin Irrigation District on April 1, 2018, after nearly 47 years with the District. During my tenure, I have been responsible for the completion of numerous capital improvement projects, at substantial savings to the District, and have authored many of the standards and policies that are in place today. I played an essential role in the development of the successful water conservation incentive program. Additionally, I was responsible for the design, project management and implementation of the award-winning state-of-the-art Division 9 Irrigation Enhancement Project. The project involved utilizing a reservoir and pump station to provide pressurized water to the growers that met all their water demand needs. This project was designed to maximize water efficiency by allowing customers to order their water on-line. I was extremely grateful that the District named the reservoir in my honor, upon my retirement.

In the past, it was widely viewed that the District's function was to only provide water service to the farmers. That perception has changed significantly with delivery of treated water to the cities, use of facilities for stormwater, joint groundwater issues, water rights issues, and the potential to provide retail electric services.
