Satisfactory Proof of Identity

A voter can meet the proof of identity requirement by presenting **either** a current and valid photo identification **or** other acceptable document, as set forth below. Also, the proof of identity requirement only applies to federal elections. Therefore, all registrants shall be permitted to vote a regular ballot in all non-federal elections without showing ID.

The following items may be presented to the election official if the <u>photograph and name</u> of the individual presenting it are present:

Title 2, California Code of Regulations, Section 20107(d)(1) – Photo Identification

- A. Driver's license or identification card of any state;
- B. passport;
- C. employee identification card,
- D. identification card provided by a commercial establishment;
- E. credit or debit card;
- F. military identification card;
- G. student identification card;
- H. health club identification card;
- I. insurance plan identification card.

These other documents will be sufficient if the document includes the <u>name and address</u> of the individual presenting it, and is dated since the date of the last general election, unless the document is intended to be of a permanent nature such as a pardon or discharge.

Other documents include a:

- A. utility bill;
- B. bank statement;
- C. government check;
- D. government paycheck;
- E. document issued by a governmental agency;
- F. sample ballot issued by a governmental agency;
- G. voter notification card issued by a governmental agency;
- H. public housing identification card issued by a governmental agency;
- I. lease or rental statement or agreement issued by a governmental agency;
- J. student identification card issued by a governmental agency;
- K. tuition statement or bill issued by a governmental agency;
- L. insurance plan card issued by a governmental agency;
- M. discharge certificate, pardon, or other official document issued to the voter in connection with the resolution of a criminal case, indictment, sentence, or other matter;
- N. public transportation authority senior citizen discount card issued by a governmental agency;
- O. identification document issued by governmental disability agencies;
- P. identification document issued by government homeless shelters and other temporary of transitional facilities;
- Q. drug prescription issued by a government doctor or other governmental health care provider;
- R. property tax statement issued by a governmental agency;
- S. vehicle registration or certificate of ownership issued by a governmental agency.
