Message From The Registrar of Voters' Office

Students took center stage in civic engagement during the highly anticipated Mock Election Day pilot program, conducted in collaboration with the San Joaquin County Office of Education, an interactive event designed to inspire the next generation of voters.

Hosted at one school site in each supervisorial district, the event began each day at 8:30 a.m. with the setup of mini mock polling locations, followed by a warm welcome from school staff.

At 9:00 a.m., presentations began with special appearances by a County Supervisor and the San Joaquin County Registrar of Voters, Olivia Hale, who each shared powerful personal stories and emphasized the importance of every voice in a democracy.

The Registrar reflected on her journey growing up in Stockton overcoming obstacles, and reminding students that voting isn't just a right, but a powerful tool to shape their future.

Each County Supervisor expanded that message, offering insight into their role in local government and their own path to civic leadership. Both speakers and school staff highlighted the importance of student voices and the value of early civic involvement.

The presentation concluded with closing remarks from the attending County Supervisor and Olivia, who encouraged students to recognize that democracy begins with participation. After a brief Q&A and an explanation of the voting process, students moved into the final portion of the event: casting student centric ballots in a realistic mock election experience.

Each event not only educated—it empowered. Students and staff were introduced to the Student Election Officer Program and encouraged to speak with their families about voter preregistration.

The future of voting in San Joaquin County is bright—and it starts with today's youth.


We offer voter registration workshops, collaborate with local organizations, and provide helpful resources to encourage informed and active participation in the electoral process.
