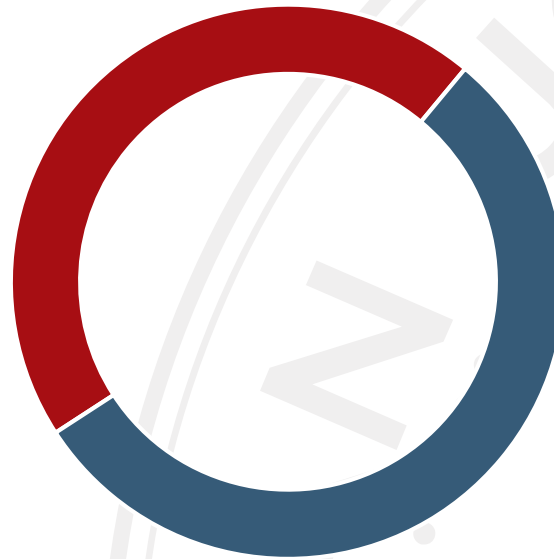

Ballots Cast at Polling Places & Vote-By-Mail (VBM) Ballots

- Only 16,449 people, or 4% of San Joaquin County's registered voters, went to a polling place to vote.
- We received 161,595 VBM ballots total for the 2022 General Election.
- 98,420 VBM ballots were received from Monday, November 7, 2022 through Election Day. This includes VBM ballots received up to 7 days after Election Day but postmarked by Election Day.
 - 23,300 VBM ballots were dropped off at polling locations on Election Day.
- 49,602 VBM ballots were dropped off at Official Dropbox locations throughout the County.

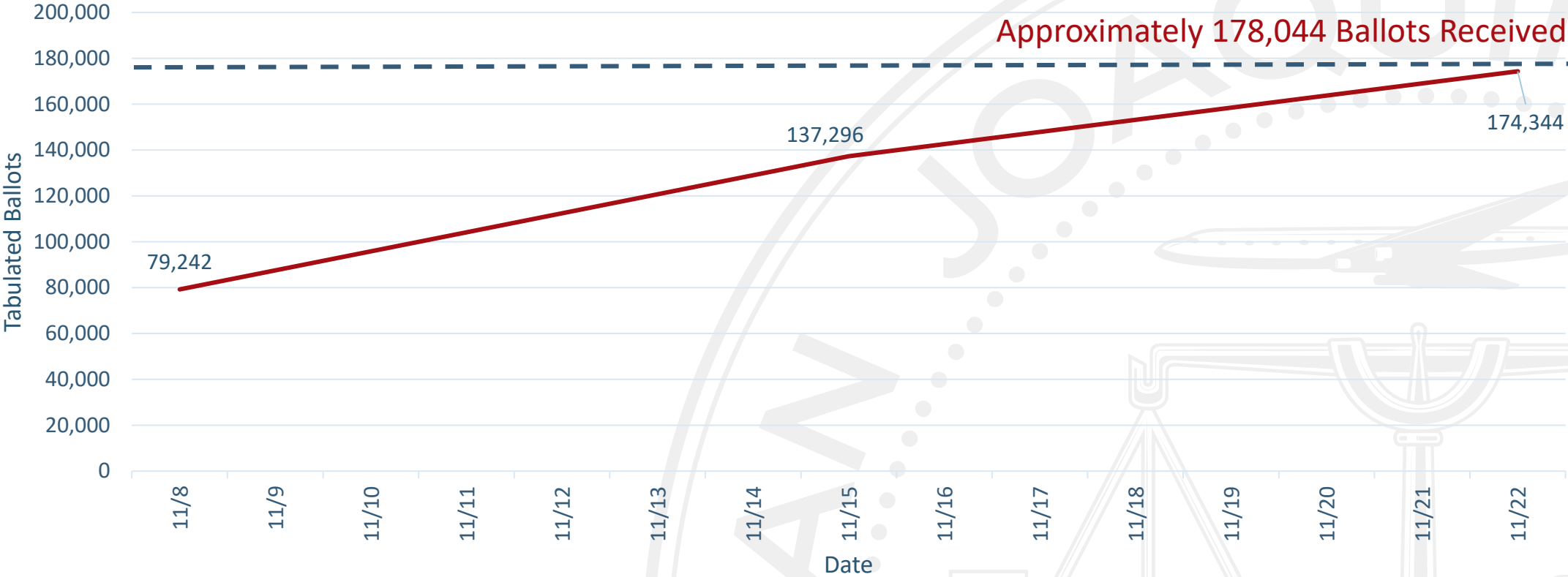

Stockton East Water District

- The General Election turnout for the entire SEWD area (all 7 Divisions) was approximately 28.7%.
- The supplemental ballot turnout was approximately 24.8%, just 3.9% below the General Election turnout for the SEWD area.
- Given the small difference between the General Election and supplemental ballot voter turnout within the SEWD area, it appears the mitigation plan put in place with the approval of the Secretary of State and SEWD was successful.

Transparency & Integrity

- As always, our doors are open and the public is invited to tour the operation at any time.
- Numerous community members, candidates, and current representatives of the community have visited in the last few weeks to see the ballot-counting process.
- Media outlets such as Fox 40, KCRA, The Record, Mountain House Matters, Tracy Press and Stocktonia News have reached out and/or visited our office.

Lessons Learned & Best Practices from June Accomplished in November

- 2022 General Election
 - All ballots were printed in landscape orientation to ensure the barcodes were printed clearly.
 - ROV received test ballots for each precinct to ensure they scanned properly before Vote-by-Mail ballots were sent to voters.
- ROV conducted outreach to encourage voters to either vote in person at polling places or mail their VBM ballots early to avoid delays in reporting election results.
- We added two staff members that helped the team to deliver a successful November Election.
